Description of content: The notified draft document contains models of the application form for importing <i>in vivo</i>-derived ovine embryos (<i>Solicitud de importación de embriones ovinos recolectados in vivo</i>) and the international veterinary certificate for the importation of <i>in vivo</i>-derived ovine embryos into the Argentine Republic (<i>Certificado veterinario internacional para amparar la importación de embriones ovinos recolectados in vivo a la República Argentina</i>).</p> <p>Among other requirements, the document establishes that neither the farm of origin nor the embryo collection centre must have any officially reported cases of foot and mouth disease, bluetongue, vesicular stomatitis, infection caused by <i>Brucella abortus</i> or <i>Brucella melitensis</i>, contagious agalactia, enzootic abortion of ewes, Nairobi sheep disease, ovine pulmonary adenomatosis or maedi-visna in the four (4) months prior to the first collection date of the embryos for export.</p> <p>Furthermore, donor females in the farm of origin and in the centre where embryos for export to the Argentine Republic are collected must have been held for a 30-day pre-collection period immediately prior to the first collection date.</p>
