5. Title, language and number of pages of the notified document: Proposed Amendment to the Food and Drug Regulations (1315 — Fosetyl-aluminum) (English and French; pages 1401-1404)
6. Description of content: The Pest Management Regulatory Agency (PMRA) of Health Canada has recently approved an application to amend the registration of fosetyl-aluminum in order to allow its use for the control of downy mildew on bok choy cabbage and Chinese broccoli. This proposed regulatory amendment would establish a Maximum Residue Limit (MRL) for residues of fosetyl-aluminum resulting from this use in bok choy cabbage and Chinese broccoli, in order to permit the sale of food containing these residues. After the review of all available data, the PMRA has determined that an MRL for fosetyl-aluminum of 60 p.p.m. in bok choy cabbage and Chinese broccoli would not pose an unacceptable health risk to the public. As a means to improve the responsiveness of the regulatory system, an Interim Marketing Authorization (IMA) was issued on 9 November 2002, to permit the immediate sale of Chinese broccoli and bok-choy cabbage containing residues of fosetyl-aluminum with an MRL of 60 p.p.m. while the regulatory process to formally amend the Regulations is undertaken.
