6. Description of content: The document contains technical details on proposals to amend the New Zealand (Maximum Residue Limits of Agricultural Compounds) Food Standards 2012. MPI proposes to add the following new MRLs to the MRL Standards: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• 0.2 mg/kg for methoxyfenozide when used as an insecticide on nectarines and peaches and 0.8 mg/kg when used as an insecticide on blueberries;• 0.2 mg/kg for spinetoram in mammalian fat, 0.01 mg/kg in mammalian kidney, 0.01 mg/kg in the mammalian liver and 0.01 mg/kg in mammalian meat when used as an insecticide on forage brassicas;• 0.02 mg/kg for spirotetramat when used as an insecticide on grapes; and• 0.1 mg/kg for tulathromycin in cattle meat and fat, 3 mg/kg in cattle offal, 0.5 mg/kg in pig meat, 0.3 mg/kg in pig fat/skin, 3 mg/kg in pig kidney and 2 mg/kg in pig liver when used as an antibiotic in cattle and pigs.
