## NOTIFICATION

The attached notification in the context of actions taken within the framework of the Decision on Measures Concerning the Possible Negative Effects of the Reform Programme on Least-Developed Net Food-Importing Developing Countries for **1999/2000** (**Table NF:1**) was received from the delegation of **Canada** on 12 March 2001.

**REPORTING PERIOD: 1999/2000**

**(1) Quantity of food aid provided to least-developed and net food-importing developing countries:**

For the period of 1 August 1999 to 31 July 2000, Canada provided a total of 289,464 tonnes of food aid to Least-Developed Countries (LDCs) and Net Food-Importing Developing Countries (NFIDCs). This volume of food aid had a total value of \$104.73<sup>1</sup> million in 1999/2000. See Table A, "Canadian Food Aid to LDCs and NFIDCs, 1 August 1999 – 31 July 2000", which provides information for the period in question on the quantity of Canadian food aid provided to LDCs and NFIDCs with a breakdown by region and individual country and by commodity, quantity in metric tonnes, total value, and value of the portion which is channelled through the World Food Programme (WFP).<sup>2</sup> In addition to the food aid directed to these specific LDCs and NFIDCs, \$2.01 million worth of Canadian food aid was distributed through the WFP to 'Central America Regional', a portion of this food aid may have impacted on LDCs and NFIDCs in the region.

In addition, in FY1999/2000<sup>3</sup>, Canada provided a total of \$85.97 million in food aid to other developing countries (non-LDCs and NFIDCs).

In accordance with the Food Aid Convention (FAC 1999), for the crop year 1 July, 1999 to 30 June 2000, Canada fully met its undertaking to provide a minimum of 420,000 tonnes of food aid in wheat equivalent for that period.

**(2) Indication of the proportion in fully grant form or appropriate concessional terms:**

All Canadian food aid is provided in fully grant form.

### **(3) Technical and financial assistance under paragraph 3(iii) of the Decision:**

The Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA) is the primary agency responsible for the disbursement of Canadian official development assistance (ODA). CIDA delivers programs through bilateral (government-to-government) channels, partnership programs, as well as through multilateral channels.

In FY1999/2000, Canada provided an estimated<sup>4</sup> total of \$2.02 billion in ODA, of which CIDA managed \$1.61 billion. \$125.61 million was channelled via the International Development Research Centre (IDRC) which undertakes bilateral projects with a scientific or research focus. The Department of Foreign Affairs and International Trade (DFAIT) is responsible for a small portion of ODA for certain grants and contributions to international organizations, which usually have only a partial development mandate. Finally, the Department of Finance is also responsible for a portion of Canadian ODA involving contributions to the World Bank, the International Development Agency (IDA) and the Enhanced Structural Adjustment Facility of the International Monetary Fund (IMF).<sup>5</sup>

The ODA contributions managed by the Department of Finance do not fall within the purview of this notification. Information related to agriculture and related technical assistance<sup>6</sup> provided to LDCs and NFIDCs via CIDA, IDRC and DFAIT in FY1999/2000 is set out below.

## **THE CANADIAN INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY**

### **Bilateral (Government-to-Government) Programmes**

CIDA's bilateral assistance is delivered through three geographic branches (Africa & the Middle East, Asia, and Americas & the Caribbean) as well as a special program for Central and Eastern Europe<sup>7</sup>. Total bilateral programming (for the three core geographic regions) was \$700.03 million in FY1999/2000<sup>8</sup>.

Canadian Bilateral programming consists of government-to-government programs and projects which are carried out in accordance with bilateral agreements and planned in co-operation with the country via the Country Development Policy Frameworks (CDPFs). In FY 1999/2000, bilateral programming supported 463 projects in 58 of the LDCs and NFIDCs for a total value of \$ 296.00 million. This represents approximately<sup>9</sup> 42 per cent of the total amount of Canadian bilateral programs. \$23.98 million worth of bilateral programming directed at LDCs and NFIDCs, was in agriculture and related programming, which is approximately 3.4 per cent of total Canadian bilateral ODA, and approximately 8.1 per cent of the bilateral programming going to these countries. Country specific information on agricultural and related technical support to LDCs and NFIDCs via the bilateral channel, in FY 1999/2000 is as follows:

### Multilateral Core Funding

Table C below represents CIDA's total FY 1999/2000 contribution to specific multilateral organizations with mandates that relate, completely or in part, to agriculture and/or food security. Given the nature of multilateral organizations' funding and programming activities, no specific portion of Canadian contributions can be identified as targeted directly to LDCs or NFIDCs.

Nevertheless, Canadian support to the World Food Programme (WFP) and the Consultative Group on International Agricultural Research (CGIAR) in particular, are likely to be relevant to this notification.

### Canadian Partnership Branch

The Canadian Partnership Branch (CPB) supports the activities of international non-governmental organizations (NGOs) and Canadian organizations, academic & research institutions and private sector firms in their development programs and projects with people and organizations of developing countries. It is comprised of five divisions:

- the Non-Governmental Organization (NGO) Division provides contributions for projects and programs that build partnerships including support for: International Non-Governmental Organizations (INGOs); Canadian NGO programmes; volunteer sending agencies; and the NGO project facility;
- the Institutional Cooperation Division (ICD) focuses on overseas development-related activities of Canadian post-secondary institutions including support for the Educational

Institutions Program (EIP) as well as a section for scholarships; Environmental NGOs; and Institutions. Also included in this division are the Cooperative, Unions and Professional Associations Program (CUPA) which encourages cooperation through these groups;

- the Industrial Cooperation Division (INC), facilitates development-related activities with the Canadian private sector;
- the Youth Action Division is geared to promoting youth action for development;
- finally, the Policy, Strategy, Planning and Operations (PSPO) Division is largely a policy group but also undertakes special programs such as: funding to facilitate NGO participation at international conferences.

In FY 1999/2000, CPB disbursed a total of \$272 million on some 1,451 projects and programs. CPB support is designed to be flexible and responsive to the diversity of civil society and complex development needs. Therefore, it is often cross-sectoral in nature and can involve multiple numbers of countries and/or regions, as well as a variety of mechanisms for funding activities including via program and project. Consequently, it is difficult, in a large portion of the disbursements being channelled through Canadian voluntary organizations, to identify data on specific sectors of activities or in particular countries (in this case agriculture related activities in LDCs and NFIDCs). The exception is the Industrial Co-operation Program, where country and sector specificity is possible. The following two tables (Table D and E) provide data for CPB programming for LDCs and NFIDCs for the INC program, and for the other Voluntary programs as a whole, where there is indication of agricultural and related project activity.

The INC program's total disbursements for FY 1999/2000 was \$39.87 million on 475 projects, \$2.62 million of which was disbursed on 39 agriculture and related projects in 21 countries. \$1.14 million was disbursed on 16 agriculture and related projects operating in 12 LDCs and/or NFIDCs. Agriculture programming directed at LDCs and NFIDCs, therefore, represents about 44 per cent of the total agricultural activity of the INC program and 3 per cent of the total overall INC program.

For the "CPB Voluntary Program" (excluding INC), total disbursements for FY 1999/2000 were \$232 million on more than 1,000 programs, projects and activities. Some 282 agriculture and related projects, with a total value of \$8.25 million, were operational in 44 LDCs/NFIDCs. It is important to note that the information provided in Table E for the "CPB Voluntary Programs" (excluding INC) should be considered as a minimum indication only. Significant relevant CPB

programming may not be reported here. Where there is a clear indication of agriculture and related activity in the focus countries, the disbursement has been indicated in Table E. However, it has not always been possible to capture information for projects/programs with only a sub-theme of agriculture, or with a regional/global rather than country specific focus.

### THE INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT RESEARCH CENTRE (IDRC)

The International Development Research Centre (IDRC) is a Canadian public corporation, which supports scientific research focused to meet the priorities of developing countries and the basic needs of the world's poor. In FY1999/2000 its total budget (including administrative costs) was \$125.61 million. In FY 1999/2000, IDRC undertook disbursements in the agriculture sector totalling \$7.48 million, which represented about 6% per cent of their total allocation.

A review for FY1999/2000 of IDRC projects disbursing in LDCs and NFIDCs in agriculture and related sectors, identified some 49 projects with a value of \$2.9 million (about 39% of all disbursements in agriculture) as per the following Table F:

In addition to the \$2.9 million in agriculture and related projects in LDCs and NFIDCs indicated in Table F above, IDRC invested \$3.06 million in agriculture and related projects in global and regional research, some of which will likely benefit the countries in question.

#### **DEPARTMENT OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS AND INTERNATIONAL TRADE**

Canada's annual core contributions to multilateral organizations such as the Food and Agricultural Organization (FAO), the Inter-American Institute for Co-operation on Agriculture (IICA) and the World Meteorological Organization (WMO) are channelled through the Department of Foreign Affairs and International Trade. In FY1999/2000, these contributions were, respectively, \$12.6, \$4.9 and \$1.8 million. A portion of these contributions can be assumed to contribute to food security related activities because of the mandates of these multilateral organizations.

#### **(4) Other relevant information with respect to actions taken within the framework of the Decision:**

Some Canadian provincial governments also have small international assistance programs which may provide agriculture and related technical assistance to LDCs and NFIDCs.

Canadian aid offices in developing countries administer small Mission Administered Funds (MAFs) which respond to small-scale, country specific requests. Some of these funds, where they exist in LDCs and NFIDCs, may have agriculture and related sector impacts.

Table G is included as a Voluntary Submission to this Notification. This table provides information on Canadian technical assistance to LDCs and NFIDCs in the sectors of fisheries and agro-forestry. This table has been included to ensure that the Committee is provided with full information on technical assistance provided by Canada, which contributes to the food security situation of the countries in question.
