**REPORT (2007) OF THE COMMITTEE ON IMPORT LICENSING  
TO THE COUNCIL FOR TRADE IN GOODS**

1. The Agreement on Import Licensing Procedures (hereinafter "the Agreement") which entered into force on 1 January 1995, establishes disciplines on users of import licensing systems with the principal objective of ensuring that the procedures applied for granting import licences do not in themselves restrict trade. It aims to simplify, clarify and minimize the administrative requirements necessary to obtain import licences.
2. The Committee on Import Licensing was established to afford Members the opportunity of consulting on any matters relating to the operation of the Agreement or the furtherance of its objectives. The Committee's Rules of Procedure, which were approved by the Council for Trade in Goods, are contained in document G/L/147.
3. All Members of the WTO are *ipso facto* members of the Committee. Observer governments in the General Council of the WTO have Observer status in the Committee. The International Monetary Fund, the World Bank and UNCTAD have regular Observer status in the Committee.
4. The focus of this report is on the period since the Committee's last annual report (G/L/800), i.e. 30 October 2006 - 8 October 2007 (hereinafter "the review period"). During the review period, the Committee held two meetings on 2 April and 8 October 2007 (G/LIC/M/25 and G/LIC/M/26). At its meeting on 2 April 2007, the Committee took note of the nomination of Mr. Marco J. Kassaja (Tanzania) as Chairperson of the Committee for the current year and elected him by acclamation. At that meeting, the Committee elected as Vice-Chairperson for the current year, Mrs. Anna Ashikali (Cyprus). Pursuant to Committee's Rules of Procedure, they took office at the end of that meeting.
5. Pursuant to Articles 1.4(a) and/or 8.2(b) of the Agreement and procedures agreed by the Committee, all Members are required to notify their laws, regulations and administrative procedures relevant to import licensing and submit copies of any relevant publications or laws and regulations upon becoming a WTO Member. Any subsequent changes to these laws, regulations and administrative procedures are also required to be notified. Since the entry into force of the WTO Agreement, 94 Members<sup>1</sup> have notified the Committee of their legislation and/or publications under these provisions. During the review period, the Committee received eleven notifications from the following eight Members: Armenia, Costa Rica, India, Kuwait, Mauritius, Thailand, Tunisia and Turkey. These notifications may be found in document series G/LIC/N/1/-. Copies of publications and legislation submitted with these notifications are available for consultation in the Secretariat.
6. The Committee also received, pursuant to paragraphs 5.1-5.4 of Article 5, seven notifications relating to the institution of new import licensing procedures or changes in these procedures from four Members: Argentina, Costa Rica, India and Korea. These notifications may be found in document series G/LIC/N/2/-. Since the entry into force of the WTO Agreement 27 Members<sup>3</sup> have submitted

notifications under these provisions. Article 5.5 of the Agreement allows Members to submit reverse notifications, where a Member considers that another Member has not notified the institution of a licensing procedure or changes in the procedures. However, no such reverse notifications have been received under this provision since the entry into force of the Agreement.

7. Article 7.3 of the Agreement requires all Members to provide replies to the Questionnaire on Import Licensing Procedures<sup>2</sup> by 30 September each year. Since the entry into force of the WTO Agreement, 89 Members<sup>1</sup> have made notifications under this provision. This includes replies to the Questionnaire from 11 Members in 1995, 22 Members in 1996, 25 Members<sup>1</sup> in 1997, 26 Members in 1998, 20 Members<sup>1</sup> in 1999, 32 Members<sup>1</sup> in 2000, 23 Members<sup>1</sup> in 2001, 41 Members<sup>1</sup> in 2002, 25 Members<sup>1</sup> in 2003, 21 Members<sup>1</sup> in 2004, 19 Members<sup>1</sup> in 2005, 38 Members<sup>1</sup> in 2006 and 24 Members<sup>1</sup> in 2007. During the review period, the Committee received 29 notifications from the following 24 Members: Argentina; Armenia; Barbados; Cameroon; Chile; Costa Rica; Dominica; European Communities; Gambia; Grenada; Haiti; India; Indonesia; Japan; Korea; Macao, China; Nigeria; Peru; the Philippines; Singapore; Thailand; Trinidad and Tobago; Tunisia and Turkey. These notifications may be found in document series G/LIC/N/3/-.

Written comments and questions from Members concerning the notifications submitted to the Committee and/or on import licensing procedures maintained by Members, and replies thereto, may be found in document series G/LIC/Q/-<sup>3</sup>. During the review period, such comments and questions were submitted by Australia to Malaysia (G/LIC/Q/MYS/4), Mexico to Guatemala (G/LIC/Q/GTM/2), the United States to Argentina (G/LIC/Q/ARG/3), to Brazil (G/LIC/Q/BRA/3/Add.2 and Add. 3) and to Indonesia (G/LIC/Q/IDN/7/Add.2). Responses were provided by the United States to China (G/LIC/Q/USA/2), by China to Australia (G/LIC/Q/CHN/20), by Indonesia to the United States (G/LIC/Q/IDN/8/Add. 1 and Add.2), by Malaysia to Australia (G/LIC/Q/MYS/5), by India to the United States (G/LIC/Q/IND/10), by Guatemala to Mexico (G/LIC/Q/GTM/3 and by Argentina to the United States (G/LIC/Q/ARG/4).

9. The Committee has provided a regular forum for the discussion of specific notifications submitted by Members. As evident in the Annex to this report, there continues to be a low level of compliance with the mandatory notification requirements under Articles 1.4(a), 8.2(b) and 7.3 and with the ad hoc notification requirement under Article 5. This low level of compliance of Members with the transparency obligations of the Agreement has been the main preoccupation of the Committee for some time now.

10. At its meetings of 2 April and 8 October 2007, the Chair expressed continuing concern over the failure of many Members to submit the required notifications and once again urged Members who had not yet notified and had not updated their notifications or provided clarifications sought by other Members to do so as soon as possible.

11. At its meeting of 8 October, the Committee conducted the sixth transitional review, as appropriate to its mandate, of the implementation by China of the WTO Agreement and of the related provisions of its Protocol of Accession<sup>4</sup>, as provided for in Paragraph 18 of the Protocol on the Accession of the People's Republic of China to the WTO (G/LIC/M/22, paragraphs 3.1-[3.xx]). The United States posed questions to China (G/LIC/Q/CHN/21). The report of the Committee to the Council for Trade in Goods on this review is contained in document G/LIC/[ ].
