### Addendum

The following communication, dated 20 July 2005, is being circulated at the request of the Delegation of the United States.

---

#### Ethyl Maltol; Exemption from the Requirement of a Tolerance

This regulation establishes an exemption from the requirement of a tolerance for residues of 2-ethyl-3-hydroxy-4H-pyran-4-one, with a limitation in the pesticide formulation of not more than 0.2%. This pesticide is also known as ethyl maltol when used as an inert ingredient in or on growing crops, when applied to raw agricultural commodities after harvest, or to animals.

This regulation is effective 30 June 2005. Comments must be received on or before 29 August 2005 identified by OPP-2005-0153 by Registration Division (7505C), Office of Pesticide Programs (OPP), Environmental Protection Agency, 1200 Pennsylvania Ave., NW., Washington, DC 20460.
