To facilitate capital-based technical officials to attend meetings of the WTO TBT Committee. To facilitate the National TBT/SPS Committee Secretariat with funds required for operating and carrying out the activities of the National TBT/SPS Committee. To train technical officials on the development of technical regulations, standards and conformity assessment procedures based on international good regulatory best practices. To setup a system to be used for getting feedback from the industry and exporters on trade related problems/concerns they experience in accessing markets of WTO Member States. To replace the Internet connectivity at the WTO TBT National Enquiry Point with state-of-the-art Internet connectivity to enable the Enquiry Point to effectively carry out its information dissemination obligation as required by the TBT Agreement. To review the national conformity assessment systems with a view to develop a workable framework that facilitates trade. To benchmark the national standardization process with Annex 3 of the TBT Agreement. To support the Ugandan National Bureau of Standards in the areas where it does not have testing capacity, in accreditation of non accredited laboratories and human resource capacity development. To build capacity in developing mutual recognition agreements with a view to facilitating trade. To develop capacity in animal health systems that will lead to effective scientific risk analysis and management with regard to animal diseases, vectors, apiculture – sericulture, veterinary inspection – certification and regulatory enforcement. To carry out annual residue monitoring programme for honey and other bee products.
