**NOTIFICATION OF LAWS AND REGULATIONS
UNDER ARTICLE 63.2 OF THE AGREEMENT**

CAMEROON

The following communication, dated 13 July 2001, is being circulated at the request of the delegation of the Republic of Cameroon.

Pursuant to Article 63.2 of the Agreement on Trade-Related Aspects of Intellectual Property Rights, the Government of Cameroon hereby informs the Council for TRIPS that it has no national laws or regulations relevant to the Agreement.

A national charter of culture is, however, being developed and will be forwarded to you once it is finalized.

With regard to other trade-related aspects of intellectual property rights, the Government of Cameroon applies the provisions of the following laws, agreements and conventions:

- Law No. 94/01 of 20 January 1994 on Forestry, Wildlife and Fisheries;
 - the Paris Convention of 20 March 1883, revised on several occasions;
 - the Berne Convention, signed in 1886;
 - the Convention on Biological Diversity;
 - the Bangui Agreement of 2 March 1997, currently under revision;
 - the TRIPS Agreement of 1994.
