### **State Ownership and Privatization**

The accomplishing of tasks in the sphere of privatization is based on the following principles: the principle of combination of long-term and short-term interests of the State during privatization; the principle of differentiated approach to privatization of enterprises depending on their liquidity; principle of expanding privatization instruments, principle of on-going monitoring and control.

### **Legal framework**

Basic legal documents according to which the privatization of state property in the Russian Federation is currently taking place are the following: the Federal Law On the privatization of the State property and on the Principles of Privatization of the Municipal Property in the Russian Federation №123-FZ of 21 July 1997 (as amended on 23 June 1999, 5 August 2000), the State Program of Privatization of State-Owned and Municipal Enterprises in the Russian Federation 1994 (approved by the Decree of the President of the Russian Federation №2284 of 24 December 1993) (as amended on 14 March 1996, 6 October 1997, 15 July 1998, 25 July, 1 August 2000) and Basic Provisions of the State Program of Privatization of State-Owned and Municipal Enterprises in the Russian Federation after 1 July 1994 (approved by the Decree of the President of the Russian Federation №1535 of 22 July 1994) (as amended on 16 April 1998, 25 January 1999).

The Government of the Russian Federation annually, simultaneously with the draft federal law on the federal budget for the respective year, submits to the State Duma of the Federal Assembly of the Russian Federation the draft federal law on the introduction of amendments and addenda into the Privatization Program.

The Government of the Russian Federation annually, before April 1 of the current year, submits to the Federal Assembly of the Russian Federation a report on the implementation of the Privatization Program in the course of the past year.

The Privatization Program contains:

- a forecast of the privatization of the state property in the respective sectors of the Russian Federation economy;
- a forecast of an increase in the internal and the external investments into the Russian Federation economy as a result of the privatization of the state property;
- demands, made on the privatization programmes of the subjects of the Russian Federation;
- the order of selecting methods for the privatization of the state property;
- the procedure for estimating the cost of the privatized state property;
- the procedure and the normatives for the distribution of the monetary means, derived as a result of privatization of the federal property etc.

Moreover the facilities and enterprises that are federal, state-owned and municipal property are divided into the following groups as regards the possibility of their privatization in the Privatization Program:

- facilities and enterprises that are federal property, the privatization of which is prohibited;
- facilities and enterprises that are federal property, the privatization of which is subject to approval by the Government of the Russian Federation;
- facilities and enterprises that are federal property, the privatization of which is subject to approval by the federal executive power body, possessing the powers for performing the functions of the management and of the disposal of the state property in agreement with the

- federal executive power bodies, endowed with the powers for the coordination and the regulation of the activity in the respective sectors of the economy;
- state-owned (municipal) facilities and enterprises, the privatization of which under the Programme is subject to approval by the government authorities and administration bodies of the subjects of the Russian Federation and under local privatization programs;
- federal, state-owned (municipal) facilities, and enterprises subject to compulsory privatization;
- facilities and enterprises which are privatized with the prohibition or restrictions of the participation in its privatization of foreign natural and legal persons.

In the course of bringing into life the program decisions the federal laws and the other legal normative acts of the Russian Federation, the laws and the other legal normative acts of the subjects of the Russian Federation, as well as the decisions of the local self-government bodies are being passed, which shall not contradict the main Federal Law on privatization and the Privatization Programme.

### The terms of participation of foreign legal and physical bodies in the process of privatization

Terms of participation of foreign legal and physical bodies in privatization process and investment activities are regulated by Federal Law On the privatization of the State property and on the Principles of Privatization of the Municipal Property in the Russian Federation №123-FZ of 21 July 1997, by Federal Law On Foreign Investment in the Russian Federation №160-FZ of 9 July 1999 and by the State Programme of Privatization of State-Owned and Municipal Enterprises in the Russian Federation 1994 (Approved by the Decree of the President of the Russian Federation №2284 of 24 December 1993).

Concerning foreign participation in privatization acts national treatment. Foreign investors can take part in an auction, tender and commercial tender with the investment and (or) the social terms.

Foreign investors' participation in the privatization of facilities and enterprises engaged in trade, public catering and consumer services, as well as of small enterprises in industry, construction, and automobile transportation are in all cases subject to approval by local government authorities.

Decisions on the possibility of foreign investors' taking part in the privatization of facilities and enterprises of the defence industry (if the defence order accounts for more than 30 per cent of their gross output), the oil and gas industry, the mining and processing of strategic material ores, precious and semi-precious stones, precious metals, radioactive and rare-earth minerals, transport and communications are made by the Government of the Russian Federation or authorities of subjects of the Russian Federation as applicable (depending on the kind of state property involved) simultaneously with a decision on privatization of such facilities and enterprises.

Foreign investments cannot be used for privatization of state-owned and municipal enterprises located within closed territorial entities, if not otherwise provided for by decrees of the Government of the Russian Federation.

### **Results of privatization**

As a result of restructuring of property relations in the Russian Federation by means of privatization the number of privatized enterprises as of January 1, 2001 (from 1992) comprised 130,180.

The table below shows data on number of privatized State-Owned and Municipal Enterprises:

In 2000 much fewer enterprises were privatized compared to 1999. The similar trend was observed in 1999 compared to 1998. The steady decrease in the number of privatized enterprises is explained by the fact that privatization of the major number of the enterprises, including enterprises in oil industry, metallurgy, sea and river transport, which are the most attractive for investors has been already completed.

At the same time there is a tendency of increasing the total volume of financial assets obtained by means of privatization. In 2000 revenues from the sale of shares packages of joint-stock companies and state property comprised 31,367.6 mln. rubles.

The increase in revenues by means of privatization is explained to a great extent by the usage of a new conception of state property management (approved by the Decision of the Government of the Russian Federation №1024 of 9 September 1999). The Conception determines new policy, which includes the individual approach to the choice of objects of privatization, presale evaluation of property, control of the effectiveness of management of state property.

The sector structure of privatization is shown in the table 2 below:

At present there are 22135 state-run unitary enterprises in the Russian Federation, including 11,128 Federal state-run unitary enterprises. The number of commercial companies with the participation share of federal state property comprises 3524, in that number according to the share of federal property in their authorized capital:

- 100% of authorized capital 61 joint-stock company;
- more than 50 % of authorized capital 506;
- from 25 % to 50 % of authorized capital -1,211;
- less than 25 % 1,746.

### **Methods of privatization**

The following privatization methods, specified by the Federal Law On the privatization of the State property and on the Principles of Privatization of the Municipal Property in the Russian Federation №123-FZ of 21 July 1997, are used in the privatization of the state and of the municipal property:

- the sale of the state or of the municipal property at an auction, including the sale of the shares of open joint-stock companies, created in the course of privatization, at a specialized auction;
- the sale of the state or of the municipal property at a commercial tender with the investment and (or) the social terms;
- the sale of the shares of open joint-stock companies, set up in the course of privatization, to their own workers;
- the redemption of the rented state or municipal property; the transformation of the state and the municipal enterprises into the open joint-stock companies, 100 per cent of whose shares are in the state or in the municipal ownership;
- putting the state or the municipal property by way of contribution into the authorized capitals of economic companies;
- the alienation of the shares of open joint-stock companies, set up in the course of privatization, which are in the state or in the municipal ownership, in favour of the owners of the state or of the municipal securities, certifying the right to acquire such shares.

A specific method of privatization of an enterprise is determined by a working privatization commission. When selecting methods of privatization of enterprises a differentiated approach is used depending on their liquidity and specifics.

Auction and commercial tender with the investment and (or) the social terms are the main methods of selling state property in the course of privatization. For instance, in 2000 56% of state property of Russian Federation subjects were sold through auctions.

### Goals in the sphere of privatization

The potential "portfolio" of the shares packages, planned for sale, includes shares of the number of oil and coal companies, transport and communication enterprises, and engineering industry. It is planned to perform restructuring and privatization of about 3.5 thousand Federal state unitary enterprises in 2001; it is planned to sell shares of over 500 joint-stock companies in 2001.

### **Production of Goods and Services by State-Owned Enterprises**

In accordance with the Decision of the Government of the Russian Federation No.1 of 4.January 1999, the state owned enterprises are state organizations, institutions, unitary enterprises, as well as companies and enterprises which either fully belong to the state or where the state owns controlling (over 50 percent) interests (shares).

At present enterprises with state property share in Russia are responsible for 14% of the total production of goods and services. The minimum share of state participation is in retail trade (Table 4). Full State monopoly remains in the sector of railroad transport. In the sphere of scientific research and development the share of public sector enterprises comprises 63,3%

The number of staff of public sector enterprises in 2000 was 11,373.6 thousand people, or 22.6% of the employed population.

In 2000 foreign investments to the public sector enterprises constituted over 16 mln. dollars, while general volume of foreign investments into Russian economy constituted 11 billion dollars.

### Comprehensive List of Tariff exemptions (based on the Law "On Customs Tariff")

#### **Article 34.** Tariff Preferences

Tariff benefits (preferences) for goods shall be established hereunder and may not be individual in nature other than in such cases as are described by <u>Articles 35</u>, <u>36</u> and <u>37</u> of this Law. Tariff preferences shall be granted exclusively by decision of the Russian Government.

A tariff benefit (preference) shall be understood to mean a benefit granted on the basis of reciprocity or unilaterally in implementing Russia's commercial polices on goods moved across the Russian customs border in the form of a <u>refund</u> of earlier paid duties, exemption from duties, reduced duties or tariff quotas on preferential imports (exports) of goods.

### **Article 35.** Exemption from Duties

The following shall be exempt from duties:

- a) transport vehicles engaged in the international transportation of freight, luggage and passengers, as well as materials, equipment, rigging, fuel, food and other effects required for their normal operation en route or during stopovers, or acquired abroad in connection with a breakdown of (damage to) such vehicles;
- b) material, equipment, rigging, fuel, food and other effects exported outside the Russian customs territory to support the operations of Russian ships engaged in sea fisheries or sea fishery ships leased (chartered) by Russian persons, as well as the products of such operations imported into the Russian customs territory;
- c) goods imported to the Russian customs territory or exported there from for official or personal uses by representatives of foreign States or individuals entitled to import such goods duty-free pursuant to Russia's international agreements or Russian legislation;
- d) Russian and foreign currency other than that used for numismatic purposes, as well as securities pursuant to Russian legislative acts;
- e) goods subject to nationalization by the State in cases envisaged by Russian legislation;

<u>Decision</u> of the Government of the Russian Federation No. 816 of 18 July 1996 established that concessions on payment of tax duties as regards goods imported to the customs territory of the Russian Federation as humanitarian aid shall not cover excisable goods, as well as goods imported under foreign trade agreements (contracts) the latter providing that Russian persons are to pay for these goods

- f) goods imported to the Russian customs territory and exported there from as humanitarian aid; or in order to deal with the effect of accidents, disasters and natural calamities; study aides for free educational, pre-school and medical treatment institutions;
- g) goods imported to the customs territory of the Russian Federation as gratuitous aid (assistance) as well as imported to the territory and/or exported from the territory for charitable purposes along the lines of states, international organizations, governments including among other things for the purposes of providing technical aid (assistance);

- h) goods moved under customs control in transit across the Russian customs territory and meant for third countries:
- i) goods moved across the Russian customs border by natural persons for personal use pursuant to the Customs Code of the Russian Federation;
- j) equipment, instruments and materials imported on the customs territory of the Russian Federation for implementation of the purpose oriented social and economic programs (projects) of the housing construction for servicemen, foundation, construction and maintenance of the centers for vocational retraining of the servicemen, ex-servicemen and their family members carried out for the expense of loans, credits and gratuitous financial aid being provided by the international agencies and governments of foreign states, foreign legal entities and natural persons in accordance with Inter-Governmental and Inter-State Agreements, as well as Agreements signed on behalf of the Government of the Russian Federation by the state executive bodies authorized by it;
- k) periodical printed publications and book products connected with education, science and culture, imported by the editorial offices of the mass media and the publishing houses into the customs territory of the Russian Federation and exported therefrom;
  - paper, polygraphic materials and polygraphic carriers, carriers of audio and video information, technological and engineering equipment imported into the customs territory of the Russian Federation by the editorial offices of the mass media, publishing houses, information agencies, tele- and radio broadcasting companies, polygraphic enterprises and organizations and used by them for the output of the products of the mass media and the book products connected with education, science and culture.

The privileges stipulated by the present item shall not apply to the books and periodical printed publications of advertising and erotic character and the mass media of advertising and erotic character;

- the fire-technical products, imported into the customs territory of the Russian Federation to ensure the operation of the administrative bodies and units of the State Fire-fighting Service of the Ministry of Internal Affairs of the Russian Federation in the process of performance of their functions, established by the legislation of the Russian Federation;
- m) equipment, including machinery, mechanisms and materials being part of the set of delivery of respective equipment as well as components (excluding the ones subject to excise taxation) imported to the customs territory of the Russian Federation to offset the loans provided by foreign states and international financial organizations under the international treaties of the Russian Federation:
- n) goods imported to the customs territory of the Russian Federation, including those imported on leasing in order to perform works under a production sharing agreement in accordance with a program of such works and with the investor's budget approved in the manner set out in the agreement or those exported from the territory in question in keeping with the terms of such agreement. In such case import and export customs duties shall be replaced with the division of the products pursuant to terms of a production sharing agreement concluded in accordance with the Federal Law on Production Sharing Agreements.

Exemption from the customs duty shall be granted only in the cases as provided in the international treaties of the Russian Federation;

o) baby food manufacturing equipment (components and spare parts for it) acquired at the expense of earmarked federal budget funds, the equipment being of the kind not manufactured in the Russian Federation, as per the list endorsed by the Government of the Russian Federation as well as baby food manufacturing equipment (components and spare parts for it) acquired at the expense of stringed foreign credits extended to the Russian Federation by foreign states of foreign governments. The said privilege covers the baby food manufacturing equipment (components and spare parts for it) that has been imported (being imported) to the customs territory of the Russian Federation for the purpose of implementing the federal target program "Developing Baby Food Industry" of the <u>presidential program</u> "The Children of Russia".

### **Article 36.** Granting of Customs Preferences

In Russia's trade and political relations with foreign countries Russian Customs Tariff preferences may be granted in the form of exemption from duties, reduced duties or tariff quotas on preferential imports (exports) with respect to the following goods:

- goods originating from countries, which form a free trade zone or a customs union with Russia or which have signed agreements aiming to create such zone or union; and
- goods originating from developing countries and using Russia's national system of preferences, which shall be periodically, but at least once in five years, reviewed by the Russian Government.

### Article 37. Granting of Tariff Benefits

In Russia's commercial policies followed in its customs territory tariff benefits may be granted in the form of a <u>refund</u> of earlier-paid duties, cut-rate duties, or in exceptional cases, exemption from duties with respect to the following goods:

- goods imported to the Russian territory and/or exported therefrom temporarily under customs control under the appropriate customs arrangements established by the Customs Code of the Russian Federation;
- goods exported as part of complete deliveries for the construction of investment cooperation projects abroad pursuant to intergovernmental agreements, to which Russia is a party;
- goods exported from the Russian customs territory as part of suppliers to meet federal state needs, as determined pursuant to Russian legislative acts.

Goods imported to the Russian customs territory as a contribution to the statutory funds of enterprises with foreign investment and of foreign companies, as well as individual kinds of goods of their own production imported by such enterprises and companies in cases envisaged by agreements on division of output, concluded by the Russian Government or a state agency authorized thereby in accordance with Russian law, or during the period of recouping foreign investments in accordance with such procedure as is established by the Supreme Soviet of the Russian Federation.

The tariff was set for Russian coastal-traffic vessels, Russian foreign-going vessels and foreign vessels.

For the Russian foreign-going vessels and foreign vessels the rates of dues are set in US dollars. The Russian vessels shall make payments in rubles at the exchange rate of the Central Bank of Russia as of the day of the vessel's departure.

The currency used for settling the charges collected from vessels of CIS countries shall be regulated by interstate agreements.

Tariff surcharges and relieves shall be applied to basic rate. If several relieves are applicable to a vessel, the greatest of these relieves shall be applied.

School, field-study and training ships shall be exempted from all types of charges. During charges collecting, vessel nationality and granted status shall be determined by the flag the vessel is flying, irrespective of the entity, which owns or uses it (see Article 5 of Open Sea Convention dated 29.04.58).

A voyage of a Russian ship shall be considered as foreign-going, if the vessel arrives to a Russian port after load handling in a foreign port or gets under way to a foreign port for load handling.

For voyages not covered by this definition, charges shall be collected in accordance with coastal traffic tariff. The charges shall be collected for the voyage, which is ended with vessel arrival to the port.

For vessels arriving to the port in ballast, charges shall be collected for the voyage, which is the aim of this arrival. For vessels sailing from the port in ballast, charges shall be collected for the voyage, which is ended with vessel arrival to the port.

Conventional capacity of a vessel, in cubic meters, shall be determined as a product of three values specified in vessel documents: maximum length of the vessel, maximum width of the vessel and maximum height of the board of the vessel.

For vessels transporting cargo on the upper deck or having no less than two decks, the board height used in calculations shall be no less than a half of maximum width of the vessel.

Conventional capacity of barge-towboat trains, caravans or other floating facilities composed of individual elements used for calculating all types of charges, except for ecological dues, shall be determined as a sum of capacities of individual elements.

Charges from lighter-aboard ships carrying out handling operations with lighters in the outer and inner harbour shall be collected in accordance with capacity of lighters handed over by a lighter-aboard ship on entering the port and received by it on sailing out of the port.

For calculating all types of charges, conventional capacity of Ro-Ro, Lo-Ro, Ro-Flow and OBO vessels, as well as container carriers, shall be multiplied by a factor of 0.7. For calculating all types of charges, capacity of double-bottomed or double-boarded tankers, as well as tankers with isolating ballast tanks, shall be multiplied by a factor of 0.85.

Type and specialization of a vessel shall be determined based on vessel documents.

Charges shall be paid by a vessel prior to sailing from port.

## 4. Wharfage

Shall be collected for 1 cubic meter of vessel conventional capacity for each day of vessel being alongside. The wharfage dues are collected from vessels staying alongside the berth. For the vessels of groups "A", "B" and "H" wharfage dues are charged per 1 m³ of the conventional volume of the vessel for each day of the vessel's stay alongside the berth. The time of stay at a berth is rounded off upward to one-half of the day.

For the vessels of groups "C", "D", "E", "F" and "G" berth dues are charged per 1m<sup>3</sup> of the convetional volume for each call.

### Value Added Tax

- 1. The major and vitally essential drugs, including medicine substances, among others those prepared by pharmacies, except for raw material (materials) for their preparation, vitamin-rich and treatment and preventive products of food, meat, dairy, fish and flour-and-cereals industry, household disinfectant, insecticides and deratization means, diapers, repellents, goods for veterinary uses, containers and packing;
  - major and vitally essential items of medical use;
  - major and vitally essential medical equipment;
  - artificial limbs and orthopedic articles, raw materials for their manufacture and semifinished articles for above:
  - technical facilities, including motor vehicles, materials which can be used only for disability prevention or rehabilitation of invalids;
  - lenses and rims for glasses (except for sunglasses);
  - food products produced directly by canteens of universities and schools, canteens of other
    educational institutions, canteens of medical organizations, children's preschool
    establishments and sold by them to aforesaid establishments, and also food products
    manufactured directly by organizations of public catering and sold by such to aforesaid
    canteens.
- 2. Postage stamps (except for collectable stamps), marked cards and marked envelopes, lottery tickets of lotteries conducted by decisions of the Government of the Russian Federation and/or legislative (representative) bodies of constituent entities of the Russian Federation;
  - coins made of precious metals (except for collectable coins) which are the currency of the Russian Federation, or currency of foreign states. The procedure for referring coins made of precious metals to collectable coins shall be established by the Government of the Russian Federation;
  - goods placed under the customs treatment of duty free shop;
  - goods (works, services) except for excisable goods and excisable mineral raw materials sold (performed, rendered) within the framework of rendering gratuitous help (assistance) to the Russian Federation according to the Federal Law on the Gratuitous Help (Assistance) to the Russian Federation and Addenda and Amendments to Certain Laws of the Russian Federation on Taxes and on the Establishment of Privileges under the Payments to State Extra-Budgetary Funds in Connection with the Granting of Gratuitous Help (Assistance) to the Russian Federation.
- 1. Sale of religious use objects (according to the list approved by the Government of the Russian Federation upon submission by religious organizations (associations) the former being produced and sold by religious organizations (associations) within the framework of religious activities, apart from excisable ones and also organization and holding by aforesaid organizations of religious rites, ceremonies, prayer assemblies or other cult activities;
  - sale of goods (except for excisable, mineral raw materials and mineral resources, and also other goods according to the list approved by the Government of the Russian Federation upon submission by All-Russian public organizations of disabled persons, works, services (except for broker and other intermediary services), effected and sold by:
  - public organizations of invalids (including those created as unions of public organizations of invalids) at least 80 per cent of whose membership are invalids and their legal representatives;
  - organizations which entire authorized capital consists of contributions of public organizations
    of invalids specified in paragraph two of the present Subitem if the average active roll of
    invalids among their workers constitutes not less than 50 per cent, and their share in the fund
    of wages not less than 25 per cent;

- establishments, whose asset's are owned solely by public organizations of invalids specified
  in paragraph two of the present Subitem and created to achieve educational, cultural,
  treatment-and-health improvement, physical culture and sports, scientific, information related
  and other social purposes, and also to render legal and other help to the disabled, disabled
  children and their parents;
- health treatment and industrial (labour) workshops at antituberculousis, psychiatric, psychoneurological establishments, establishments of social protection or social rehabilitation of population;
- sale of articles of folk art crafts of recognized artistic value (except for excisable goods) which samples have been registered in the order established by the Government of the Russian Federation;
- sale of ore, concentrates and other industrial products containing precious metals, scrap and waste of precious metals for further processing and refining; sale of precious metals and gems by taxpayers (except for those listed in Subitem 6 of Item 1 of Article 164 of the present Code) to the State Fund of Precious Metals and Gems of the Russian Federation, to the Central Bank of the Russian Federation and banks; sale of gems into raw materials (except for raw diamonds) to be processed by enterprises irrespective of their forms of ownership for subsequent export sale; sale of gems into raw materials to specialized foreign trade organizations, the Central Bank of the Russian Federation and banks; sale of precious metals from the State Fund of Precious Metals and Gems of the Russian Federation to specialized foreign trade organizations, the Central Bank of the Russian Federation and banks, and also precious metals in ingots by the Central Bank of the Russian Federation and banks provided that these ingots remain in a certificated vault (the State Vault of Valuables, the vault of the Central Bank of the Russian Federation or vaults of banks);
- sale of raw diamonds by producing enterprises to processing enterprises of all forms of ownership;
- intrasystem sale (transfers, performance, rendering for own needs) of goods produced (performed works, rendered services) by organizations and establishments of the penitentiary system;
- transfer of goods (execution of works, rendering of services) free of charge within the framework of charities according to the Federal Law on Charities and Charitable Organizations, except for excisable goods;
- sale of scientific and educational book products and also editorial, publishing and polygraphic activity in its production and sale;
- sale of products of own manufacture of organizations engaged in the production of agricultural products which generate 70 per cent and more of the overall share of incomes from the sale in the total sum of their incomes, the former done towards wages in kind for labour, issues in kind for labour, and also for the public catering of workers involved in agricultural works;
- sale of products of mass media, printed matter associated with education, science and culture; editorial, publishing and polygraphic works and services in the production of mass media products and books associated with education, science and culture.
- 2. The present Subitem shall not apply to mass media products of advertising and erotic nature and also to printed matter of advertising and erotic character.
- 3. Goods importation of which to the customs territory of the Russian Federation shall not be value added taxable:
  - goods (except for excisable goods) imported as the gratuitous help (assistance) to the Russian Federation, in accordance with the manner established by the Government of the Russian Federation pursuant to the Federal Law on the Gratuitous Help (Assistance) to the Russian Federation and the Introduction of Amendments and Addenda to Certain Legislative Acts of the Russian Federation on Taxes and on the Establishment of Privileges on Payments to the

- State Extra-Budgetary Funds in Connection with the Granting of the Gratuitous Help (Assistance) to the Russian Federation";
- goods listed in Subitem 1 of Item 2 of Article 149 of the Tax Code and also the raw material and component parts for their production;
- materials for production of medical immunobiological drugs for diagnostics, prevention and/or treatment of infectious diseases (under the list approved by the Government of the Russian Federation);
- valuable articles of arts handed over as gifts to establishments and referred by law of the Russian Federation to highly valuable articles of cultural and national heritage of peoples of the Russian Federation;
- all types of printed publications received by the state and municipal libraries and museums under international exchange of books and also of products of cinematography imported by specialized state organizations for the purposes of international non-commercial exchanges;
- products manufactured as a result of economic activity of Russian organizations on land lots being the territory of a foreign state covered by the Russian Federation's right of land use on the basis of an international treaty;
- process equipment, components and spare parts thereto imported as a contribution to authorized (pooled) capitals of organizations;

- goods intended for official use by foreign diplomatic and agencies equated thereto, and also for personal use by diplomatic and administrative clerical personnel of these agencies, including members of their families living together with them;
- currency of the Russian Federation and foreign currency, notes, being a legal tender (except for those used for numismatic purposes), and also financial credit instruments shares, bonds, certificates, bills of exchange;
- products of sea fishery caught and/or produced by fishing enterprises of the Russian Federation.

The Ministry of Health of the Russian Federation issued Order No. 217 dated July 20, 1998 "On Hygienic Assessment of the Manufacture, Delivery and Distribution of Products and Commodities".

This Order establishes inter alia:

- Regulations on Hygienic Assessment of Products, Commodities as well as Manufactures;
- List of Socially Significant and Potentially Hazardous Products and Commodities Subject to Hygienic Assessment by the Department of State Sanitary and Epidemiological Supervision of the Ministry of Health of the Russian Federation;
- List of Types of Products and Commodities Subject to Hygienic Assessment.

The Department of State Sanitary and Epidemiological Supervision of the Ministry of Health of the Russian Federation (Gossanepidnadzor) conducts hygienic assessment (issues hygienic approvals) of any socially significant, potentially hazardous types of products and commodities in accordance with the following List.

- 4.1 reagents for potable water treatment;

- 5.1 personal protective agents, including ointments, pastes and creams usable in industry;
- 5.2 equipment and apparatus for collective protection, materials for the manufacture of ventilation systems; and
- 5.3 waste-incinerating furnaces and units.

- 6. Medical equipment, tools and hygienic agents:
- 6.1 physiotherapeutic, diagnostic and medical treatment equipment.
- 7. Products containing sources of ionizing radiation, including generating one, which are intended for full-scale production or new technology use. Industrial waste containing natural or artificial radio-nuclides which are used as building materials, fertilizers or otherwise.
- 8. Antenna feeder systems of radio transmitting stations, radar stations (including ones for space tracking), outdoor switch-gears for high and ultrahigh voltage substations, satellite telecommunications systems.

Other hygienic approvals are issued by the Department of State Sanitary and Epidemiological Supervision of the Ministry of Health of the Russian Federation (Gossanepidnadzor), centers of state sanitary and epidemiological supervision in the subjects of the Russian Federation, regional centers of state sanitary and epidemiological supervision in transport, the Federal Center for State Sanitary and Epidemiological Supervision at the Ministry of Health of the Russian Federation or centers of state sanitary and epidemiological supervision of the Federal Agency for Medical, Biological and Extreme Problems under the Ministry of Health of the Russian Federation, authorizing manufacture, delivery and distribution of products and commodities in accordance with the Regulations on Hygienic Assessment of Products, Commodities as well as Manufactures and the following List of Products and Commodities Subject to Hygienic Assessment.

- 7. Products of mechanical engineering and instrument-making of industrial, medicinal and home use designation.
- 8. Printed products.
- 9. Products derived from natural raw materials treated (painting, impregnation, ionizing radiation etc.) in the course of production.
- 10. Materials for products in contact with human skin.

- 11. Products and articles constituting a source of ionizing radiation, including generating radiation, as well as products and commodities containing radioactive substances.
- 12. Building stock and materials in which the content of radioactive substances is restricted by hygienic standards, including industrial waste intended for recycling and use in business, as well as metal scrap.
- 13. Mobile vehicles and products of transport designation.

HS codes are not indicated as groupings of goods established by the Order do not correspond to the HS.

The Ministry of Health of the Russian Federation plans to group the goods listed in the Order as per the Russian HS during 2001.

An extract from the Price List for Services and Goods provided by the Center for Standardization and Certification of the Ministry of Health of Russia approved by the director of the Center is adduced in the Table below. Prices are the same for domestic and imported products and for services provided to domestic and foreign traders.

Any laboratory research, instrument testing and measurements, expert investigations incidental to hygienic assessment of products and goods are performed by central laboratories on contract basis. The Chief State Sanitary Physician of the Russian Federation approves the list of central laboratories. The price list for works so provided is approved by the chief officials of such centers based on the volume of such works, postal, telephone and other costs.

## **Activities Subject to Licensing**

The list of activities subject to licensing, aims and basic principals of licensing, and licensing procedure requirements are strictly determined by the Federal Law № 158-FZ of 25 September 1998 On Licensing of Certain Types of Activities<sup>2</sup>.

Licensing of certain types of activity is aimed at ensuring a single state policy in the regulation and protection of the consumers' rights and legal interests, morale and health, the ensuring of the security of the state.

Complete list of activities subject to licensing is stated in the Federal Law № 158-FZ of 25 September 1998 On Licensing of Certain Types of Activities (Table 1).

For obtaining a license an applicant shall submit to the relevant licensing body the following documents:

- 1. An application for the issuance of a license with the indication of:
  - the name and the legal-organizational form of the juridical person, its location, the name of the bank and the number of the settlement account in the bank for a juridical person;
  - the full name, the data of the identity paper of the citizen for an individual businessman;
  - the name of activity which the juridical person or the individual businessman intend to carry out, and the period of time during which the indicated activity will be carried out.
- 2. Copies of the constituent documents and a copy of the certificate on the state registration of the licensee as a juridical person (with the presentation of the originals in the case that the copies have not been notarized) for juridical persons.
- 3. A copy of the certificate on the state registration of the citizen as an individual businessman (with the presentation of the original in the case that the copy has not been notarized) for individual businessmen.
- 4. A reference on the registration of the licensee with the tax body.
- 5. A document confirming the payment by the applicant for the license of the fee for the consideration by the licensing body of the application of the applicant for the license.
