AD HOC REPORT ON COVID-19 MEASURES TAKEN BY THE EU (INCLUDING BY ITS MEMBER STATES) IN THE AGRICULTURAL SECTOR PREPARED FOR THE SPECIAL MEETING OF THE REGULAR COMMITTEE ON AGRICULTURE, 18 JUNE 2020

## SUBMISSION BY THE EUROPEAN UNION

This ad hoc report covers measures adopted by the EU and its member States in relation to the Covid-19 as of 25 May 2020.

The measures of EU member States include subsidies which have been approved by the European Commission under EU state aid rules (see the European Union Guidelines for state aid in the agricultural and forestry sectors and in rural areas 2014 to 2020¹) as well as those approved under the Temporary Framework to support the economy in the context of the coronavirus outbreak². They do not include those authorised under Commission Regulation (EU) No 702/2014³ and those considered as *de minimis* aid under Commission Regulation (EU) No 1408/2013⁴, for which there is no *ex ante* requirement for notification by EU member States to the European Commission. General schemes available to all sectors of the economy are not included in the attached list.

Measures in this ad hoc report which constitute domestic support will be included in the EU DS:1 notification covering the relevant year. For example, expenditure related to 2020 will be included in the EU DS:1 notification for the 2019/20 marketing year.

For export financing measures, whilst data is not yet available on the actual use, all measures conform to the Nairobi Ministerial Decision. Such measures will be included in the EU reply to the export competition questionnaire for 2020, to be submitted in 2021.
