- (1) BRAQ001: Brazil informs the Committee on Agriculture that the tariff rate quota for apples and pears, for imports from August to December, was not implemented, given that the applied tariffs (10%) were below the in-quota rate (13.5%) for both products. Imports during 2020 (metric tonnes): Apples 107,320 ; Pears 138,418. Brazil also clarifies that the original TRQ commitment of 10,000 tonnes is applied for both tariff item numbers (08081000, 08082001).
- (2) BRAQ002: Brazil's tariff rate quota for wheat is an *erga omnes* TRQ with zero in-quota rate. The TRQ is applicable from 18 november 2019 to 17 november 2020. More details are established by Ordinance n°44, 18 november 2019, from Ministry of Economy, Special Secretariat for Foreign Trade and International Affairs. Total imports (SH 100111; 100119; 100191; 100199) during 2020: 6,159,925 metric tonnes. Brazil also clarifies that the original TRQ commitment of 750,000 tonnes includes tariff item numbers (100119,100199). Brazilian tariff establishes duty free for wheat seeds.
