General notes:

- Description of products: The range of products in each category are those contained in Schedule V, Part IV, Section II: Export Subsidies: Budgetary Outlay and Quantity Reduction Commitments, Annex I.
- Food aid: Following the deposit of instruments of ratification, the new Food Assistance Convention entered into force on 1 January 2013. Canada's minimum annual commitment of food assistance is expressed in terms of value. Therefore, information is no longer available on a product by product basis.
- Annual commitments: The Annual Nairobi Commitment levels came into effect as of January 2016. As of 19 December 2015, Canada eliminated export subsidies for wheat, grains, vegetable oils, oilcakes, and vegetables. Canada's export subsidies on butter, cheese, skim milk powder and products using dairy ingredients will be eliminated by the end of 2020 as per Footnote 4 of the Nairobi Ministerial Decision on Export Competition. The Uruguay Round outlay commitments did not change as a result of the Nairobi Decision in respect of products covered by Footnote 4 until their elimination.
- Canada's Uruguay Round export subsidy commitments for dairy products are reported on a dairy year basis which runs from 1 August to 31 July.
