Land conservation subsidy: Responding to the need to ease restrictions on rice imports and cut agricultural supports in the wake of WTO accession, the COA implemented the "Adjusting the Cultivation System and Revitalizing Fallow Land Program". This programme is steadily adjusting the growing of rice, coarse grains, and contract sugarcane for sale to the government at guaranteed prices, while also offering payments for the maintenance of farmland in environmentally good condition by growing green manure crops or environment-friendly crops, or setting aside. In order to comply with the WTO regulations, the amount of payment is lower than the extra costs or loss of income. The COA provided assistance for fallowing on a total area of 90,136 hectares in 2015. This achieved lower domestic agricultural support goals, while taking into consideration farmland ecology and soil fertility needs.

"Applied administered price of rice" is sourced from "Taiwan Food Statistics Book" published by Agriculture and Food Agency (AFA). "External reference price" is based on the CIF price of rice imported by Hong Kong, China in 1990-1992, which serves as the arithmetic average of the price in 1990-1992. Chinese Taipei did not import rice, and thus did not have data on rice imports. Hong Kong, China is the closest territory to Chinese Taipei and shares similar rice consumption pattern with the latter; therefore, data on rice imports in Hong Kong, China are used as external reference for rice.

"Imported value and volume of rice in Hong Kong, China" is sourced from "Hong Kong Trade Statistics".

"Exchange rate of NT dollars to HK dollars" is sourced from "Hong Kong Monthly Digest of Statistics".

"Conversion rates of paddy to milled rice" is sourced from Agriculture and Food Agency (AFA).

"Eliaible production of rice" is sourced from Agriculture and Food Agency AFA.

(2) "Applied administered price of sugar" and "eligible production of sugar" are sourced from Taiwan Sugar Corporation (TSC). "External reference price of sugar" is based on the CIF imported price of sugar in 1991. Data are sourced from Taiwan Sugar Corporation (TSC).

"Applied administered price of tobacco leaves" is based on the weighted average of the prices for the purchase of different grades of locally produced tobacco leaves.

Data are sourced from "Taiwan Tobacco & Liquor Corporation" (which was transformed from Taiwan Tobacco & Wine Monopoly Bureau (TTWMB)). "External reference price of tobacco leaves" is based on the CIF price of tobacco leaves imported from Thailand in 1990-1992, which shares the same quality of those grown in Chinese Taipei. Data are sourced from TTWMB. "Eligible production of tobacco leaves" is sourced from "Taiwan Tobacco & Wine Statistical Yearbook" published by Taiwan Tobacco & Liquor Corporation (TTLC).

- Fertilizer for agricultural use is provided at preferential prices. (1)
- (2) 1. Objective: to facilitate adjustment in agricultural production and distribution so as to expedite modernization of the agricultural sector.
  - 2. For:
  - a. Farmers actually engaged in production;
  - b. Machinery should pass the functional test by Taiwan Agricultural Research Institute; c. Assistance to each farm family is limited to one machine for each type of machine.

  - 3. Subsidy for each machine does not exceed 50% of the machine price.

- (3) To subsidize the cost of transporting the fertilizers for farmers.
- (4) Fuel used for agricultural machinery is provided an exemption from 5% Business Tax and subsidized the difference of 50% oil price increase.
- (5) 1. Under Agricultural Development Act, minimum charges for electricity used directly in agricultural production may be waived when the electricity is not used; and the cumulative formulae will not be applied in the calculation of electricity used.
  - 2. The scope of exemption covers:
  - a. Electricity used for agricultural irrigation facilities;
  - b. Electricity used for agricultural planting and processing of products after harvest;
  - c. Electricity used for the refrigeration and storage of products;
  - d. Electricity used in livestock farming.
- (6) 1. The farmers' associations are entrusted by the government to conduct the livestock insurance programmes.
  - 2. Insurance coverage: dairy cattle and hogs.
  - 3. Insurance items: death of dairy cattle on farm and death of hog during transportation.
  - 4. Indemnities: the insured amount paid to farmers is varied in accordance with respective insurance programmes and limited to 80% of market value in general.
  - 5. The premiums are subsidized by the government as follows: 30% for hog transportation insurance and 60% for dairy cattle insurance.
- (7) 1. Special loans granted to farmers for:
  - a. Loan for expanding the family farm to support farmers buying lands;
  - b. Loan for farm machinery;
  - c. Loan for agricultural food industry in guidance and assistance of management;
  - d. Loan for livestock and poultry industry in improving the management efficiency;
  - e. Loan for farmers in guidance and assistance of management improvement;
  - f. Preferential loan extended to those business who move into the Agricultural Technology Park;
  - g. Loan for agriculture production and marketing groups.
