		the notification, import permits are required for the importation of most plants and some plant products, to protect against the

	introduction of pests and diseases. Permits are also required for the import, export or re-export of terrestrial plants that are on the endangered species list. Permits are only issued to a firm or individual resident in the United States. PPQ form 526 is already required for plant pests, biocontrol agents, and Federal Noxious Weeds. Earthworms are being added to the list of plant pests and pathogens and host materials requiring a permit.
