1 SESSION OVERVIEW

This proposed thematic session explores different approaches used by Members to address various issues associated with pesticide maximum residue limits (MRLs) and provides an opportunity for Members to share their experiences and best practices with regard to facilitating safe trade. Trade facilitative approaches may include harmonizing with Codex MRLs, including as a default, and establishing import tolerances, and Members have a variety of tools at their disposal to help develop least restrictive approaches to pesticide MRLs in agricultural trade. The thematic session will build off of recent work by APEC in this area and provide Members an opportunity to learn from one another and from key private sector perspectives, including those involving transition periods and channels of trade.
