- **6. Description of content:** Emergency phytosanitary measures for the importation of cucurbit seeds from all countries are being introduced to mitigate the biosecurity risk posed by Melon necrotic spot virus (MNSV) which is seed transmitted in *Citrullus lanatus* and *Cucumis melo*.
- 7. Objective and rationale: [] food safety, [] animal health, [X] plant protection, [X] protect humans from animal/plant pest or disease, [X] protect territory from other damage from pests.
- **8. Nature of the urgent problem(s) and reason for urgent action:** Seed-borne viruses of cucurbit crops are increasing their geographic range and causing significant economic consequences globally. Melon necrotic spot virus (MNSV) has recently been detected in Australia, has a limited distribution and is under official control in Australia.

MNSV is reported to be seed-borne in *Citrullus lanatus* and *Cucumis melo*; however, Australia's existing policy does not require specific risk mitigation measures against MNSV for the importation of these hosts seeds. Therefore, emergency measures against MNSV are required for the seeds for sowing of *Citrullus lanatus* and *Cucumis melo* to prevent the further introductions of this virus.

In addition to the emergency measures, Australia is currently undertaking a draft review of policy for the importation of cucurbit seeds from all countries for stakeholder consultation. All trading partners will be notified of the release of the draft review of policy for cucurbitaceous seeds for sowing by an SPS notification.
