- **Government** Department of Agriculture and Water Resources intends to make to the existing live pigeon import conditions outlined in the four health certificates. These changes are:
 - clarifications to the existing live pigeon import conditions;
 - mandatory microchipping of all pigeons as a form of identification, in addition to the existing leg band identification;
 - mandatory West Nile Virus (WNV) testing; and
 - amending the title of each certificate from "veterinary certificate" to "health certificate".

The department seeks the co-operation of competent authorities to amend their health certificates accordingly.
