Description of content: The objective of the notified document PMRL2013-105 is to consult on the listed domestic maximum residue limits (MRLs) for dimethenamid that have been proposed by Health Canada's Pest Management Regulatory Agency (PMRA). Raw Agricultural Commodity (RAC) and/or Processed Commodity MRL (ppm) 0.01 Tuberous and corm vegetables (Crop Subgroup 1C) ppm = parts per million MRLs are proposed for each commodity included in the listed crop groupings in accordance with the Residue Chemistry Crop Groups webpage http://www.hcsc.gc.ca/cps-spc/pest/part/consultations/_pmrl2013-105/index-eng.php in the Pesticides and Pest Management section of Health Canada's website.
