- **6. Description of content:** The objective of the notified document PMRL2014-30 is to consult on the listed domestic maximum residue limits (MRLs) for bifenazate that have been proposed by the Health Canada's Pest Management Regulatory Agency (PMRA).

^a Proposed to replace the established MRL of 0.35 ppm for residues of bifenazate in/on tomatoes (EMRL2008-02) and the established MRL of 1.1 ppm for residues of bifenazate in/on bell peppers (EMRL2008-02), African eggplants, eggplants, pea eggplants and Scarlet eggplants (PMRL2013-95).
