6.	<b>Description of content:</b> The objective of the notified document PMRL2014-58 is to consult on the listed domestic maximum residue limits (MRLs) for mandipropamid that have been proposed by the Health Canada's Pest Management Regulatory Agency (PMRA).  <u>MRL (ppm) Raw Agricultural Commodity (RAC) and/or Processed Commodity</u>  200 Dried basil leaves 30 Fresh basil leaves 1.0 <sup>a</sup> African eggplant, Bush tomato, coconas, currant tomatoes, garden huckleberries, goji berries, martynias, naranjillas, okras, pea eggplants, roselles, scarlet eggplants, sunberries, tree tomato 0.9 Edible-podded legume vegetables subgroup (Crop Subgroup 6A) 0.3 Ginseng roots  ppm = parts per million  <sup>a</sup> Currently, there is an MRL of 1.0 ppm established in/on Fruiting Vegetables (Crop Group 8). This MRL of 1.0 ppm will be extended to the additional commodities in/on Fruiting Vegetables (revised Crop Group 8-09).  MRLs are proposed for each commodity included in the listed crop groupings in accordance with the <i>Residue Chemistry Crop Groups</i> webpage ( <a href="http://www.hc-sc.gc.ca/cps-spc/pest/part/protect-proteger/food-nourriture/rccg-gcpcr-eng.php">http://www.hc-sc.gc.ca/cps-spc/pest/part/protect-proteger/food-nourriture/rccg-gcpcr-eng.php</a> ) in the Pesticides and Pest Management section of Health Canada's website.
