## NOTIFICATION

### Addendum

The following communication, received on 11 March 2016, is being circulated at the request of the Delegation of Canada.

#### Established Maximum Residue Limit: S-metolachlor

The proposed maximum residue limit (PMRL) document for S-metolachlor notified in G/SPS/N/CAN/986 (dated 14 December 2015) was adopted 8 March 2016. The proposed MRLs were established via entry into the Maximum Residue Limits Database and are provided directly below:

MRL (ppm)     Raw Agricultural Commodity (RAC) and/or Processed Commodity

0.5                Cucurbit vegetables (Crop Group 9)<sup>1</sup>

ppm = parts per million

<sup>1</sup> The MRL of 0.5 ppm replaces the currently established MRLs of 0.13 ppm for cucumbers and 0.10 ppm for melons (CSG9A), pumpkins, and winter squash.

MRLs are established for each commodity included in the listed crop groupings in accordance with the *Residue Chemistry Crop Groups* webpage (<http://www.hc-sc.gc.ca/cps-spc/pest/part/protect-proteger/food-nourriture/rccg-gcpcr-eng.php>) in the Pesticides and Pest Management section of Health Canada's website.

MRLs established in Canada may be found using Health Canada's *Maximum Residue Limit Database* (<http://pr-rp.hc-sc.gc.ca/mrl-lrm/index-eng.php>) on the *Maximum Residue Limits for Pesticides* webpage (<http://www.hc-sc.gc.ca/cps-spc/pest/part/protect-proteger/food-nourriture/mrl-lmr-eng.php>).
