6. Description of content: Precautionary measure relating to the presence of *Avocado Sunblotch Viroid* in various avocado-producing countries.

The notified text temporarily suspends the issuing of phytosanitary import certificates for avocados (*Persea americana* Mill) from the following countries: Australia, Spain, Ghana, Guatemala, Israel, Mexico, South Africa and Venezuela.

It orders the revision of phytosanitary requirements, through the updating of the pest risk analysis for *Avocado Sunblotch Viroid*.

- 7. Objective and rationale: [] food safety, [] animal health, [X] plant protection, [] protect humans from animal/plant pest or disease, [] protect territory from other damage from pests.
- **8. Nature of the urgent problem(s) and reasons for urgent action:** The most recent samples taken to verify the absence of *Avocado Sunblotch Viroid* in Costa Rica confirmed that the disease was not present.

The notified text therefore temporarily suspends the issuing of phytosanitary import certificates for avocados (*Persea americana* Mill) from the following countries: Australia, Spain, Ghana, Guatemala, Israel, Mexico, South Africa and Venezuela.

Existing phytosanitary import requirements for avocados will be revised and updated through a pest risk analysis.
