Description of content: Chapter H of Annex IX to Regulation (EC) No 999/2001 lays down rules for the importation into the European Union of ovine and caprine semen and embryos. These import rules are updated to reflect the conditions for intra-Union trade laid down in Annex VIII to Regulation (EC) No 999/2001 and offer to the EU's trading partners the possibility to exempt heterozygous ovine ARR embryos exported to the European Union from any classical scrapie related requirements. 7. 	<b>[X] Trade facilitating measure</b> The new rules are less stringent compared to the current EU requirements according to which heterozygous ovine ARR embryos are exempted from scrapie-related conditions. By means of the newly proposed rules, the European Union extends the scope of the exemption.
