- 6. Description of content: Ministry of Agriculture Decision No. 4/10/5/26689 dated 18 September 2014 entitled Measures Recommended by the Plant Health Committee No. (15) dated 24 August 2014. The new decision is based on phytosanitary measures concerning the imports of apples to prevent the introduction of the following quarantine pests: fruit flies (Bactrocera sp, Anastrepha sp), Grapholita molesta, Hyphantria cunea Frankliniella occidentalis, Icerya aegyptica, Quadraspidiotus perniciosus, Pseudococcus longispinus, Pseudomonas syringae pv. syringae, Pseudomonas cichorii.

In order to protect our plant wealth, prevent the entrance of quarantine pests and to prevent disruption to international trade, the measure is needed to facilitate importation from any country infested with the pests mentioned above on the following basis:

- 1. To prove in the additional declaration of phytosanitary certificates that the consignments are free from the pests mentioned above.
- 2. If the country is infested by Grapholita molesta, Hyphantria cunea, the consignment should be subjected to a cold treatment at $(1 \pm 0.5^{\circ})$ C for 40 days at origin, if not, this treatment will be done in one of our facilities after calculating the time and degrees it has spent through transfer.
- 3. If the country is infested by fruit flies (Bactrocera sp, Anastrepha sp) the consignment should be subjected to a cold treatment at $(1.5 \pm 0.5^{\circ})$ C for 40 days at origin, if not, this treatment will be done in one of our facilities after calculating the time and degrees it has spent through transfer.
- 4. If consignment came from a re-export county, it will be subjected to a cold treatment in one of our facilities.
