6.	Description of content: The bagrada bug is listed as a regulated pest in the "Quarantine Requirements for the Importation of Plants or Plant Products".
7.	Objective and rationale: [] food safety, [] animal health, [X] plant protection, [] protect humans from animal/plant pest or disease, [X] protect territory from other damage from pests.
8.	Nature of the urgent problem(s) and reason for urgent action: The bagrada bug (Bargrada hilaris) is a kind of polyphagous insect. Hosts include broccoli, potatoes, and Fabaceae crops that we import huge amount from the trading partners. Bagrada bug does not currently occur in our territory. Therefore, the outbreak status in trading partners increases the risk of introduction of bagrada bug into our territory. In order to prevent the introduction of bagrada bug into our territory, we amended the bagrada bug as a regulated pest. Importation of plants or plant products shall be subjected to appropriate quarantine treatment for mitigating the bagrada bug if they are intercepted.
