- 6. Description of content: Department of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries, South Africa is implementing measures to manage the risk of introduction and spread of Maize Chlorotic Mottle Virus and Wheat Streak Mosaic Virus that in combination cause Maize Lethal Necrosis. Introduction of Emergency Phytosanitary measures for imports of Maize Seeds and Grains from all trading partners due to the identified quarantine risk of introducing Maize Lethal Necrosis with imported Maize Seeds and Grains. Exporting countries should declare country free from Maize Chlorotic Mottle Virus and Wheat Streak Mosaic Virus OR the parent plants were inspected during active growth and found free from these pests.

- 8. Nature of the urgent problem(s) and reason for urgent action: This is a phytosanitary measure following the outbreak and spread of Maize Lethal Necrosis in several countries. The disease is not present in South Africa and the listed pests are of quarantine importance. Existing phytosanitary import requirements for Maize Seeds and Grains have been updated through a Pest Risk Analysis.
