# CODEX UPDATE TO THE TBT COMMITTEE

## INFORMATION PROVIDED BY THE CODEX ALIMENTARIUS COMMISSION (CODEX)

This document contains information provided by <u>CODEX</u> at the TBT Committee meeting of 10-12 November 2021 under Agenda Item 4 (Update by Observers).

- 1 CODEX MEETINGS HELD SINCE THE LAST SESSION OF THE TBT COMMITTEE<sup>1</sup> (2-4 JUNE 2021)
- 1.1 25<sup>th</sup> Session of the Codex Committee on Food Import and Export Inspection and Certification Systems (CCFICS25, 31 May 8 June 2021)
- 1.1.1 The principles and guidelines for the assessment and use of voluntary Third-Party Assurance (vTPA) programmes
- 1.1. CCFICS25 concluded its work on the principles and guidelines for the assessment and use of voluntary Third-Party Assurance (vTPA) programmes and forwarded to CAC44 its final adoption.
- 1.2. Revision to the Guidance on Paperless Use of Electronic Certificates (Revised Guidelines for Design, Production, Issuance and Use of Generic Official Certificates (CXG 38-2001))
- 1.3. CCFICS25 concluded its work on a Guidance on Paperless Use of Electronic Certificates (i.e. Revision to the *Guidelines for Design, Production, Issuance and Use of Generic Official Certificates* (CXG 38-2001)) and forwarded to CAC44 for its final adoption.

### 1.1.2 New work proposal

- 1.4. CCFICS25 forwarded for approval to CAC44, a proposal for new work related to a guidance on the prevention and control of food fraud.
- 1.5. The report of CCFICS25 is available on the CCFICS page on the Codex website.
- 1.2 46<sup>th</sup> Session of the Codex Committee on Food Labelling (CCFL46, 27 September 7 October 2021)
- 1.6. CCFL46 concluded work on the General Standard for the Labelling of Non-Retail Containers and on the Guidelines on Front of Pack Nutrition Labelling. CCFL will continue working on guidance on precautionary labelling and t on internet sales/e-commerce.
- 1.7. CCFL46 agreed to start new work on guidance on innovation subject to approval by CAC44. Discussions on labelling of alcoholic beverages and labelling of foods in joint presentation and

multipack formats is ongoing. CCFL46 also agreed to consider at its next session possible work on sustainability claims and food labelling exemptions in emergency situations as well trans fatty acids.

1.8. The report of CCFL46 is available on the CCFL page on the Codex website.

# 1.3 35<sup>th</sup> Session of the Codex Committee on Fish and Fishery Products (CCFFP35, 20 September - 25 October 2021, working by correspondence)

1.9. CCFFP-working by correspondence – is tasked with evaluating if the *Standard for Canned Sardines and Sardine-Type Products* (CXS 94-1981) could be amended to include the fish species *S. lemuru* (Bali Sardinella) in the list of *Sardinella* species under section 2.1. CCFFP35 agreed to establish an EWG, chaired by the Philippines and co-chaired by the EU, working in English, French and Spanish, to oversee the sensory evaluation of the candidate species, i.e *S. lemuru* and report to the CCFFP36, tentatively scheduled to take place in early 2023, on its findings, conclusions and recommendations.

# 1.4 27<sup>th</sup> Session of the Codex Committee on Fats and Oils (CCFO27, 18 to 26 October 2021)

### 1.4.1 Amendment/ revision to the Standard for Named Vegetable Oils (CXS 210-1999)

- 1.10. CCFO27 concluded its work on the revisions to *the Standard for Named Vegetable Oils* (CXS 210-1999) in respect of the composition of sunflowerseed oil and forwarded the revisions to CAC 45 (2022) for final adoption.
- 1.11. CCFO27 agreed to forward the proposed amendments to the Standard for Named Vegetable Oils (CXS 210-draft standards: inclusion of avocado oil to CAC 45 (2022) for the preliminary adoption and agreed to continue to work on outstanding issues for the consideration at the next session.

### 1.4.2 Proposed draft revision to the Standard for Olive Oils and Olive Pomace Oils

1.12. CCFO27 agreed to continue work on the proposed amendments/revision to the *Standard for Olive Oils and Olive Pomace Oils* through the Electronic working Group for the consideration at the next session.

### 1.4.3 New work proposals

- 1.13. CCFO27 forwarded four new work proposals for approval by CAC45, namely work on high oleic acid soy bean oil, sacha inchi oil and camellia oil, which would lead to revisions to *the Standard for Named Vegetable Oils* (CXS 210-1999) and new work on calanus oil which would lead to a revision of *the Standard for Fish Oils* (CXS-239-2017).
- 1.14. The report of CCFO27 will become available on the CCFO page on the Codex webpage.
