- 6. Description of content: The Proposal seeks to modernise how the Australia New Zealand Food Standards Code (the Code) is presented to create an instrument that better meets the needs of a very broad range of stakeholders in industry, commerce and enforcement and improves the Code's efficacy. For example:
 - It more clearly presents requirements that impose an obligation in relation to the conduct of a food business or the sale of food, or relating to the composition of food or labelling.
 - Other changes modify or add definitions and alter the structure of the Code to improve navigation or to address problems of expression.
 - Compositional requirements that combined definitional and requirement elements have been revised to separate the elements.
 - There is a greater reliance on definitions already present in the food acts of Australia's states and territories.

The Proposal will not significantly alter the effect of current provisions that impose requirements or obligations.

Objective and rationale, including the nature of urgent problems where applicable: All proposals to change the Code must be assessed in the context of the following objectives: (a) the protection of public health and safety; (b) the provision of adequate information relating to food to enable consumers to make informed choices; and (c) the prevention of misleading or deceptive conduct.

- 9. Proposed date of adoption: FSANZ Board approval anticipated December 2014
