### NOTIFICATION OF HONG KONG, CHINA'S PREFERENTIAL TREATMENT TO SERVICES AND SERVICE SUPPLIERS OF LEAST-DEVELOPED COUNTRIES

The following notification from the delegation of Hong Kong, China, dated 24 July 2015, is being circulated to the Members of the Council for Trade in Services.

The Permanent Mission of Hong Kong, China to the World Trade Organization in Geneva has the honour to notify the World Trade Organization Council for Trade in Services of the preferential treatment which Hong Kong, China will make available to services and service suppliers of least-developed countries in accordance with the decision made by Ministers at the WTO's Eighth Ministerial Conference on *Preferential Treatment to Services and Service Suppliers of Least-Developed Countries* (WT/L/847), and the decision made by Ministers at the WTO's Ninth Ministerial Conference on *Operationalization of the Waiver Concerning Preferential Treatment to Services and Service Suppliers of Least-Developed Countries of Least-Developed Countries (WT/L/918).* 

The preferential treatment is made available in sectors and modes of supply that are of particular export interest to least-developed countries, as set out in *The Collective Request Pursuant to the Bali Decision on the Operationalization of the Waiver Concerning Preferential Treatment to Services and Service Suppliers of Least Developed Countries* (S/C/W/356).

The preferential treatment will take effect from 1 August 2015, and is intended to be maintained for the period of the Waiver.

The following preferential treatment is made available with respect to the application of measures described in Article XVI of the General Agreement on Trade in Services.

Unless otherwise stated, all CPC references correspond to the 1991 provisional Central Product Classification (CPC) of the United Nations Statistical Office.

## ATTACHMENT ON "PRESENCE OF NATURAL PERSONS"

### 1. Definition

- a. General manager means the chief executive officer or equivalent who leads and directs an establishment in Hong Kong, China of a service supplier of a Member and who is personally responsible for the overall performance of the establishment in Hong Kong, China.
- b. Senior manager means a person who directs the establishment in Hong Kong, China of a service supplier of a Member or a department of that establishment. Such a person would normally supervise and control the work of other supervisory, professional or managerial employees in Hong Kong, China, have the authority to hire and fire or recommend hiring, firing, or other personnel actions (such as promotion or leave authorization) in Hong Kong, China, exercise discretionary authority over day-to-day operations in Hong Kong, China, and be personally responsible to the general manager for the performance of a major part of the establishment in Hong Kong, China. The term 'senior manager' does not include first-line supervisors, unless the employees supervised are professional, nor does it include employees who primarily perform tasks necessary for the production of the service.
- c. Specialist means a person within an establishment of a service supplier of a Member who possesses knowledge at an advance level of expertise, possesses proprietary knowledge of the organization's service, research equipment, techniques, or management and who is essential to the operation of the establishment of that service supplier in Hong Kong, China.
- 2. Natural persons seeking entry are required
  - a. to be employees who have been in the prior employ of the concerned service supplier which sponsors their entry into Hong Kong, China for a period of not less than one year immediately preceding the date of application for admission; and
  - b. during their stay in Hong Kong, China, except with the prior approval of the Government of Hong Kong, China, not to change employment or employers.

3. Only natural persons of a service supplier of a Member which have a bona fide business establishment operating in Hong Kong, China will be considered for intra-corporate transfers. The number of natural persons who may seek entry is required to be reasonable having regard to the size and the nature of the business operation of the relevant establishment in Hong Kong, China.

4. Presence of such natural persons is limited to entry and temporary stay. Temporary stay implies that the appropriate prior authority will have been applied for and obtained before departure for Hong Kong, China. For general managers, senior managers and specialists, temporary stay will be limited to one year in the first instance (which may be extended up to a total of five years).
