Addendum

À sa réunion du 6 juin 2019, le Conseil des ADPIC est convenu d'inviter les organisations intergouvernementales ayant le statut d'observateur auprès du Conseil à actualiser les renseignements sur leurs programmes de coopération technique et financière en rapport avec la mise en œuvre de l'Accord sur les ADPIC.

Le présent document reprend les renseignements que l'Organisation régionale africaine de la propriété intellectuelle (ARIPO) a fournis dans une communication datée du 4 octobre 2019.

1. Le présent document rend compte des principaux programmes et activités de coopération en lien avec l'Accord sur les ADPIC et d'autres composantes de la propriété intellectuelle qui ont été réalisés par l'Organisation régionale africaine de la propriété intellectuelle (ARIPO) du 1^{er} octobre 2018 au 20 septembre 2019, suite à l'invitation à fournir des renseignements actualisés sur ces activités lancée par le Président du Conseil des ADPIC de l'OMC dans sa lettre du 28 juin 2019.
2. Pendant la période considérée, l'ARIPO a réalisé, seule ou en collaboration avec ses partenaires de coopération, des activités qui s'inscrivaient dans le cadre de coopération de l'Accord sur les ADPIC et qui avaient essentiellement pour objets le renforcement des capacités et la sensibilisation.
3. En ce qui concerne le renforcement des capacités, l'ARIPO a continué à aider financièrement les étudiants des États membres inscrits au programme de maîtrise en propriété intellectuelle offert par l'Université Africa de Mutare (Zimbabwe), en collaboration avec l'OMPI et l'Office japonais des brevets. L'ARIPO parraine également un programme analogue (MPhil) au Ghana (en collaboration avec l'Université de science et de technologie Kumasi Kwame Nkrumah) et en Tanzanie (en collaboration avec l'Université de Dar es-Salaam). Pour ce qui est de la sensibilisation, l'initiative phare menée en collaboration avec l'OMPI consiste en l'organisation de semaines consacrées à la propriété intellectuelle dans certains États membres.
4. Un autre élément important qui mérite d'être souligné est la conduite d'une mission de haut niveau en Eswatini du 13 au 15 mai 2019 en collaboration avec l'Organisation mondiale de la propriété intellectuelle (OMPI). Les objectifs de cette mission comprenaient l'évaluation de la mise en œuvre du Plan de développement de la propriété intellectuelle élaboré en 2015 avec l'appui technique de l'OMPI, la présentation au Cabinet du Royaume d'Eswatini d'un exposé sur "la propriété intellectuelle et le développement et le rôle de l'Office de la propriété intellectuelle" et la sensibilisation des hauts fonctionnaires gouvernementaux à la propriété intellectuelle.

5. Le tableau ci-après contient des détails sur les activités de coopération technique et financière menées par l'ARIPO en lien avec l'Accord sur les ADPIC et d'autres composantes de la propriété intellectuelle. Cela comprend des initiatives de formation et des activités de sensibilisation, l'assistance aux offices nationaux de la propriété intellectuelle des États membres de l'ARIPO et des publications.

3 rd Symposium on Copyright and Related Rights (1 st Regional meeting for African Heads of Copyright Offices)	Nairobi, Kenya, 10 – 14 June 2018	<p>The 3rd edition of the Symposium was organized in the framework of the Tripartite Agreement among WIPO, ARIPO and OAPI that was executed in 2018 during the 58th Sessions of the WIPO Assemblies. Participants came from 45 Countries across Africa.</p> <p>One of the outcomes of the meeting is the adoption of the Nairobi Strategic Plan for the Development of Copyright and Related Rights in Africa, a the strategy that will guide every African Country to achieve the development of an effective and efficient Copyright system.</p>
High Level Round Table on Geographical Indications	Yaoundé, Cameroon, 4 – 5 June 2019	<p>The Conference was jointly organized by WIPO, ARIPO and OAPI. The Conference, which is also an initiative in the framework of the Tripartite Agreement, was organized under the theme: "<i>Geographical Indications in Africa: Territorial Development, Economic Integration and International Trade</i>". The China National Intellectual Property Administration (CNIPA) also provided assistance in the organization of the Conference. Participants to the Round Table came from ARIPO and OAPI Member States.</p> <p>One of the main outcomes of the round table is the Declaration of Yaoundé that highlights items and activities to be implemented at the national level to develop systems of protection and valorisation of Geographical Indications (GIs) and other distinctive signs of products of origin related to the quality for the benefit of local producers and local development.</p>
IP Week	Accra, Ghana, 6 – 10 May 2019	<p>The IP week is an initiative that is part of the Cooperation Agreement between WIPO and the two African regional Organizations (ARIPO and OAPI) which is aimed at strengthening the capacity of selected Countries that have taken steps to harness the IP system to accelerate their economic transformation. The IP Week has been conceived as a 5-day national event that targets two groups of stakeholders in back to back workshops dedicated to capacity building and introduction of various IP tools available in various areas of economic activity.</p> <p>The Countries that were selected this year are: Cameroon, Ghana, Kenya, Rwanda and Uganda.</p> <p>Workshops in that regard have been jointly organised by WIPO and ARIPO in Ghana, Kenya and Rwanda.</p>

In Kenya and ...</p> <p>The IP Week in Rwanda attracted 98 participants from SMEs, Research Institutions and handicraft sector.</p> <p>In Kenya, over 100 participants from SMEs and Universities and Research and Development Institutions attended the workshops.</p> <p>As a follow up to these workshops, projects will subsequently be initiated in those two priority areas in consultation with the national IP Offices and the relevant stakeholders.</p>

Seminar on the role of Intellectual Property in media broadcasting	Harare, Zimbabwe, 12 March 2019	This one-day Seminar was organised by ARIPO and the Zimbabwe Broadcasting Corporation (ZBC) for the benefit of the ZBC staff members. The Seminar is part of the Agreement that was signed in 2017 between ARIPO and ZBC with the aim of creating awareness of the large public on Intellectual Property among other objectives.
WIPO-ARIPO Regional Meeting on developing the Regional Technology and Innovation Support Centre (TISC) Network	ARIPO Headquarters, Harare, 19 – 20 September 2019	The meeting was jointly organised by WIPO and ARIPO, with support from the Japan Patent Office. The meeting aimed at making follow up on developments in the regional TISCs that following the ARIPO Regional TISC Action Plan that was adopted drawn up in the Meeting of 2018 and adopted by the ARIPO in November 2018, and discussing the next steps with regard to Action Plan.
Patent Drafting Course	ARIPO Headquarters, Harare, 2 – 6 September 2019	<p>The training course was organized by WIPO in cooperation with ARIPO, with the support from the Japan Patent Office (JPO).</p> <p>The particularity of the 2019 edition of the Course is the important number of participants from Universities and Research and Development Institutions from 16 ARIPO Member States and other African Countries (Ethiopia, Niger, Nigeria and South Africa).
