COMMUNICATION FROM PERU

The following communication, dated 21 October 1985, received from the Permanent Mission of Peru is circulated to participating countries subject to the requirements of confidentiality.

The Permanent Mission of Peru has the honour to refer to the Peruvian initiative launched in the context of the procedures for review of schedules of concessions, approved on 18 May 1983 (document CPC/69).

In this connection the Permanent Mission of Peru is forwarding herewith a list of eleven tariff headings which, subject to negotiation, the Peruvian Government would be disposed to include in its schedule of concessions. Also listed are two tariff headings which would be withdrawn from Peru's schedule of concessions because of the fact that no imports have been recorded in the years since the Protocol entered into force.
