## <u>GATT Office Circular No. 116</u> <u>Seventeenth Training Course</u> (February 1964 to July 1964)

## FELLOWSHIP PROGRAMME

1. The following officials have received fellowships from the United Nations Technical Assistance Administration to follow the seventeenth training course at the GATT secretariat, held in the English language:

3. The purpose of the fellowship scheme and the general programme of work are described in GATT document INT(64)11 of 27 January 1964. As the participants in the scheme have or may have in the future responsibilities in the framing of the commercial or tariff policies of their governments, the training course will not be limited to the operation of GATT but will cover also the general problems which have to be taken into account in the formation of an efficient commercial policy, especially in less-developed countries. On the other hand, the course will remain practical in its methods and stress will be laid on the necessity for individual and independent work by the participants.

Mr. Constant Shih is Director of the In-Service Training Programme, Office of the Executive Secretary, and in this capacity is responsible to the Deputy Executive Secretary for the GATT Fellowship Programme. Mr. Shih is assisted by Mrs. D. Willard, Office of the Executive Secretary.
