#### ANNEX

### (Translation)

## Notes

- 1.- This document lists the concessions granted by Member States to CONTRACTING PARTIES. These concessions have been transposed into the Common Tariff. When they do not correspond exactly to a tariff item or sub-item of the Common Tariff, they have been inserted in the item or sub-item and numbered with arabic numerals.
- 2.- The bindings granted by each Member State have been underlined in the column relating to that Member State. The indications contained in columns 9 and 10 relate to that Member State. For each binding by a Member State, the other Member States have indicated in the columns 3 to 6 the duties of the national tariffs relating to the product which has been bound. The duties marked (x) relate to products on which a concession has been granted in whole or in part and is indicated elsewhere. The duties which have not been underlined nor marked (x) are the autonomous duties of 1 January 1957 (with the exclusion of any total or partial suspension).
- 3.- Duties marked (+) are concessions granted to Switzerland up to 31 December 1961.
- 4.- The references indicated by Benelux in column 8 are those contained in the tariff on 1 March 1960.
