- 1) A Delegation of the Macao Government and a Delegation of the European Communities met on 1 February 1983 in Brussels for consultations pursuant to an agreed minute forming an integral part of the Agreement on trade in textiles initialled on 43th December 1982.
- 2) As a result of these consultations, Macao agreed to limit its exports of products falling into categories 71, 76 to United Kingdom and 75, 80 to france to the following levels:
