Dear Mr. Chairman:

This is to confirm my earlier oral notifications that:

(a) the United States had requested consultations with Pakistan on July 30, 1984, pursuant to article 3 of the Arrangement with respect to man-made fiber work gloves (category 631 part); and

(b) pending a mutually satisfactory solution, the United States had on October 4, 1984, pursuant to Article 3.5(i) established a restraint limit of 78,256 dozen pairs for the twelve-month period beginning July 30, 1984, and ending on July 29, 1985. A copy of the U.S. note, which includes the detailed factual statement called for in paragraph 3 of article 3 of the arrangement is attached.

## U.S. - PAKISTAN STATEMENT

-- I HAVE THE HONOR TO REFER TO THE ARRANGEMENT REGARDING INTERNATIONAL TRADE IN TEXTILES, WITH ANNEXES, LONE AT GENEVA ON DECEMBER 23, 1973, AND EXTENDED BY PROTOCOL ADOPTED ON DECEMBER 22, 1981 AT GENEVA (HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS THE ARRANGEMENT).

-- MY GOVERNMENT HAS NOTED A SHARP INCREASE IN IMPORTS OF MAN-MADE FIBER WORK GLOVES (CATEGORY 631 (PART)), CURRENTLY CLASSIFIED IN TARIFF SCHEDULE OF THE UNITED STATES (TSUSA) NUMBERS 704.3215. 704.8525. 704.8550. AND 704.9000. MY GOVERNMENT HAS CONCLUDED THAT IMPORTS FROM PAKISTAN IN CATEGORY 631 PART ARE CAUSING MARKET DISRUFTION IN THE UNITED STATES AND ARE THREATENING TO IMPEDE THE

ORDERLY DEVELOPMENT OF TRADE AS CONTEMPLATED UNDER ARTICLE THREE OF THE ARRANGEMENT. A DETAILED FACTUAL STATEMENT OF THE REASONS AND JUSTIFICATIONS FOR THIS

CONCLUSION. WITH CURRENT SUPPORTING DATA. IS APPENDED AS ANNEX A WHICH IS TO BE REGARDED AS AN INTEGRAL PART OF THIS NOTE. ACCORDINGLY, THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES HEPEBY REQUESTS CONSULTATIONS WITH THE GOVERNMENT OF PAKISTAN TO DISCUSS APPROPRIATE LEVELS OF RESTRAINT FOR PAKISTAN'S EXPORTS OF CATEGORY 631 PART. WOPK GLOVES. TO THE UNITED STATES.

TO WHICH BOTH THE GOVERNMENT OF PAKISTAN AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES ARE PARTIES, IF OUR TWO GOVERNMENTS ARE UNABLE TO AGREE ON A MUTUALLY SATISFACTORY SOLUTION TO THIS MATTER WITHIN SIXTY DAYS, THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES RESERVES THE RIGHT TO RESTRAIN SUCH IMPORTS PRODUCED IN PAKISTAN AND EXPORTED DURING THE TWELVE-MONTH PERIOD BEGINNING ON THE DATE OF YOUR PECEIPT OF THIS REQUEST, TO A LEVEL NOT LESS THAN THE LEVEL OF UNITED STATES' IMPORTS FROM PAKISTAN DUPING THE FIRST TWELVE OF THE MOST RECENT FOURTFEN MONTHS, WHICH IS THE PEPIOD OF MAY 1, 1983 TO APRIL 32, 1984, THAT LEVEL IS 78,256 DOZEN PAIR (273.896 SQUARE YARDS EQUIVALENT).

CATEGORY 631 PT. -- MAN-MADE FIBER
-- WORK GLOVES

PAKISTAN JULY 1984

CATEGORY 631 PT. IMPORTS FROM PAKISTAN WERE 136 PERCENT HIGHER DURING THE YEAR ENDING JUNE 1984. AT 121.336 DCZEN PAIR. THAN DURING THE PREVIOUS TWELVE MONTHS. JANUARY-JUNE 1984 IMPORTS. AT 26,600 DOZEN, WERE 5U PFRCENT HIGHER THAN IN ALL OF 1983 AND PAKISTAN SUPPLIED NO MAN-MADE FIBER WORK GLOVES TO THE UNITED STATES IN 1982. THIS IS A SHARP AND SUBSTANTIAL INCREASE IN IMPORTS WHICH, IF CONTINUED, CREATES A REAL THREAT OF MARKET DISRUPTION.

U.S. PRODUCTION OF MAN-MADE FIBER WORK GLOVES -DECLINED STEADILY IN THE PAST THREE YEARS WHILE IMPORTS, INCLUDING GLOVES FROM PAKISTAN, INCREASED A DRAMATIC 155 PERCENT.

U.S. PROTUCTION OF CATEGORY 831 PT. GLOVES HAS DECLINED 32 PERCENT IN THE PAST THREE YEARS, FROM 694.2200 DOZEN IN 1981 TO 470.020 DOZEN IN 1993. IMPORTS. ON THE OTHER HAND, INCREASED 155 PERCENT FROM 1.070.020 DOZEN IN 1981 TO 2.736.022 DOZEN IN 1983. CONSEQUENTLY, WITH AN IMPORT TO PRODUCTION RATIO OF 582.1 PERCENT IN 1983 COMPARED WITH 152.2 PERCENT IN 1981, FOR EVERY MAN-MADE FIBER WORK GLOVE PRODUCED DOMESTICALLY NEARLY SIX WERE IMPORTED.

SIXTY-ONE PERCENT OF THE CATEGORY 631 PT. IMPORTS FROM PAKISTAN ENTERED UNDER 704.8525 -- CUT-AND-SEWN KNIT GLOVES WITHOUT FOURCHETTES AND 22 PERCENT ENTERED UNDER TSUSA NO. 704.8550 -- KNIT GLOVES OTHER THAN CUT-AND-SEW. THESE GLOVES ARE PEING ENTERED AT DUTY-PAID VALUES WHICH ARE BELOW THE U.S. PRODUCER PRICES FOR COMPARABLE ITEMS.
