Attached is a notification from the Commission of the European Communities concerning a modification of the EEC/Macao Article 4 agreement. A new agreed regional restraint has been introduced on imports into Ireland of woven industrial and occupational clothing (Category 76) from Macao for the period 1984 to 1986.

In connection with the European Economic Community's Agreement on trade in textile products with Macao initialled on 3 July 1982 and negotiated pursuant to Article 4 of the Arrangement as extended by the 1981 Protocol of Extension, I have the honour to inform you of the following.

During the course of 1984 imports of woven industrial and occupational clothing (category 76) from Macao into Ireland exceeded 2 tonnes, being the level at which the Community could ask for consultations with a view to establishing a regional limit under the provisions of Article 5 of the bilateral Agreement. The Community having deemed that there was real risk of market disruption in this case, the two sides consulted on 29 October 1984 in pursuance of Article 16 of the Agreement. As a result of these consultations, and in conformity with the provisions of the Agreement, Macao agreed to limit exports to Ireland as follows :

This new limit contained in the Agreed Minute annexed to this letter, is herewith communicated under Article 4, Paragraph 4, of the Arrangement, as a modification to the Community's Agreement with Macao notified in 1984 and circulated under COM/TEX/SB/974 to the T.S.B.

- A delegation of Macao and a delegation of the European Communities met on 29 October 1984 in Brussels for consultations pursuant to Articles 7 and 16 of the Agreement on trade in textiles initialled on 3 December 1982.
- 2. As a result of the consultations, Macao agreed to limit its exports of products falling under category 76 to Ireland to the following levels:
