UNITED STATES AND HUNGARY AMEND BILATERAL TEXTILE AGREEMENT

The United States and Hungary exchanged notes in Budapest on July 20, 1987 and July 29, 1987, to amend their Bilateral Textile Agreement. Text of the notes follow:

UNITED STATES NOTE

No. 345

Budapest, July 20, 1987

The Embassy of the United States of America presents its compliments to the Ministry of Foreign Trade of the People's Republic of Hungary and has the honor to refer to the Bilateral Agreement in Trade in Wool and Man-made Fiber Textiles and Textile Products between the Government of the Hungarian People's Republic and the Government of the United States of America, with Annexes, done at Budapest February 15 and 25, 1983, as amended (the Agreement). The Embassy also refers to discussions between representatives of the Governments of the United States and Hungary during July 1987.

The Embassy of the United States has the honor to propose, on behalf of the Government of the United States of America, that the Agreement be amended and extended for the period of four years, from January 1, 1988 to December 31, 1991.

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The Agreement shall be amended to allow inter-category flexibility (swing) for category 433. Annexes A and B of the Agreement shall be amended to reflect amendment and extension of the Agreement, and are attached as an integral part of this note. Carryforward will be available for the 1987 agreement year; it will not be available for the 1991 agreement year. Carryover will be available for the 1987 through 1991 agreement years.

The Government of the United States of America confirms that under paragraph 11 of the Agreement, if the Government of Hungary considers that, as a result of a limitation

specified in this agreement, Hungary is being placed in an inequitable position vis-a-vis a third country, the Government of Hungary may request consultations with the Government of the United States of America with a view to taking appropriate remedial action such as reasonable modification of the Agreement. All other provisions of the Agreement remain unchanged.

If this proposal is acceptable to the Government of the Hungarian People's Republic, then this note and the note of confirmation of the Government of the Hungarian People's Republic shall constitute an amendment to the Agreement.

The Embassy of the United States of America takes this opportunity to present to the Ministry of Foreign Trade of the People's Republic of Hungary the assurances of its highest consideration.

HUNGARY NOTE

Budapest, July 29, 1987

The Embassy of the United States of America takes this opportunity to present to the Ministry of Foreign Trade of the People's Republic of Hungary the assurances of its highest consideration.
