Modification of the bilateral agreement between the EEC and Korea

Note by the Chairman

Attached is a notification received from the EEC of a modification of its bilateral agreement with Korea. Restraints were agreed on synthetic filament yarn (Category 41) when imported into Italy and Spain.

Dear Ambassador,

In connection with the European Economic Community's Agreement on trade in textile products with the Republic of Korea negotiated under Article 4 of the Arrangement and initialled on 7 August 1986, I have to inform you of the following.

During the course of 1987 imports of yarn of synthetic filament (Category 41) from South Korea to two regions of the European Community (Spain and Italy) exceeded respectively 381 and 686 tonnes, being the levels at which the Community could ask for consultations with a view to establishing a regional limit under the provisions of Article 8 of the Agreement. The Community having deemed that there was real risk of market disruption in these two cases, the two sides consulted on 6 August 1987 in pursuance of Articles 8 and 16 of the Agreement. As a result of these consultations, and in conformity with the provisions of the Agreement, Korea agreed to limit its exports as follows:

- 1. A delegation of the Republic of Korea and a delegation of the European Economic Community met in Brussels on 6 august 1987 for consultations under Article 8 of the bilateral Agreement on trade in textile initialled on 7 August 1986.
- 2. As a result of these consultations the Republic of Korea agreed to limit its exports of products falling under category 41 to the Community's regions of Spain and Italy as follows:
