UNITED STATES AND JAMAICA AMEND BILATERAL TEXTILE AGREEMENT

The United States and Jamaica exchanged notes to amend their bilateral textile agreement. Texts of the notes follows:

UNITED STATES NOTE

February 10, 1987

The Secretary of State presents his compliments to His Excellency the Ambassador of Jamaica and has the honor to refer to the Agreement between the United States and Jamaica relating to trade in cotton, wool and man-made fiber textiles and textile products manufactured in Jamaica and exported to the United States, including apparel and made-up textile products assembled in Jamaica wholly from components cut in the United States from fabrics formed in the United States, effected by exchange of letters in Washington, D.C. on August 27, 1986, (hereafter called "the Agreement"). The Secretary of State has the further honor to acknowledge receipt of the note of the Ambassador of Jamaica dated January 21, 1987, which reads as follows:

The Ambassador of Jamaica presents his compliments to the Secretary of State and has the honor to refer to consultations held in Washington, D.C. from August 25-27, 1986, between representatives of the Government of Jamaica and the Government of the United States of America, and to propose the following amendment to the bilateral textile agreement which was signed on behalf of the Governments of Jamaica and the United States on August 27, 1986:

"1) Annex P shall be amended to delete Category 338/339 and Category 347/348. Category 338/339/638/639 and Category 347/348/647/648 shall be added to Annex B and the levels shall be as follows:

The Ambassador of Jamaica avails himself of this opportunity to renew to the Secretary of State the assurances of his highest consideration.

The Secretary of State has the further honor to confirm that the foregoing proposed amendment is acceptable to the Government of the United States and agrees that the note of the Ambashador of Jamaica and this note on behalf of the Government of the United States of America shall constitute an amendment to the Agreement.

JAMAICA NOTE

The Ambassador of Jamaica presents his compliments to the Secretary of State and has the honour to refer to consultations held in Washington, D.C. from August 25 - 27, 1986, between representatives of the Government of Jamaica

and the Government of the United States of America, and to propose the following amendment to the bilateral textile agreement which was signed on behalf of the Governments of Jamaica and the United States on August 27, 1986:

"1) Annex B shall be amended to delete Category 338/339 and Category 347/348. Category 338/339/638/639 and Category 347/348/647/648 shall be added to Annex B and the levels shall be as follows:
