TS/140-1 and TS/140-1.1) for information on the status of restrictions maintained by the Philippines on textiles products covered by the Arrangement Regarding International Trade in Textiles, I have the honor to invite your attention to the following submissions by the Philippines to the Committee on Balance-of-Payments Restrictions:

- 1. 1986 Consultation with the Philippines, Basic Document for the Consultation (BOP/269) - Imports of certain textiles and fabrics were liberalized as of 30 April 1986 (please refer to item no. 18, Annex C, pages 25-26);
- 2. 1986 Consultation with the Philippines, Basic Document for the Consultation, Addendum (BOP/269/Add.1) Circular No. 1100 (pages 7 and 18), Circular No. 1103 (page 19), Circular No. 1109 (page 43 and pages 48-61) and Circular No. 1117 (pages 63-68) cover the liberalization of imports of several textile items;
- 3. 1986 Consultation with the Philippines,
 Basic Document for the Consultation,
 Addendum (BOP/269/Add.2) In a communication dated 2 February 1987, the
 Philippines submitted to the GATT secretariat a list of 290 items,including
 textile items, scheduled for liberalization
 not later than April 1988.
