# Cunadian Migh Commission NOTE NO: 8094

The Canadian High Commission presents its compliments to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka and has the honour to refer to the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Government of Canada and the Government of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka relating to the export from the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka of certain textiles and textile products for import into Canada, and in particular to Annex II thereof.

Canadian authorities wish to bring to the attention of the Sri Lankan authorities that (A) whereas Annex II includes in paragraph 21, garments of leather, and (B) whereas the MOU has been concluded having regard to the arrangement regarding international trade in textiles (hereinafter referred to as "the MFA"), and (C) whereas the MFA does not apply to garments of leather, and (D) whereas it is desirable to avoid an inconsistency between the MOU and the MFA, therefore, Canadian authorities wish to propose that paragraph 21 of Annex II of the MOU which read, "Leather coats, leather outdoorjackets, overcoats, topcoats and sportscoats including those made of genuine leather, genuine sheepskin and genuine suede ", be stricken from the Annex and from the coverage of the MOU.

Canadian authorities further propose that, if this deletion is acceptable to the Sri Lankan authorities, this note and the reply note from the Government of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka confirming its acceptance of this proposal constitute an amendment to the MOU to this effect.

The Ministry of Foreign Affizing of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanks presents its compliments to the High Commission of Canada and has the honour to refer to IPN No.8094 of 19th April 1988 regarding the Lemorandem of Understanding (MOU) between the Government of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanks and the Government of Canada relating to the export from Ori Lanks of certain textile and textile products for import into Canada and in particular to Annex II thereof.

The Government of the Democracic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanks confirms its acceptance of the proposal to delate purigraph 21 of Annex II to the MOU and remove from the coverage of the MOU "Leather coats, limither outdoor-jackets, overcoats, topcoats and sportscoats including those made of genuine leather, genuine sheepskin and enuine suede".

The Government of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Eri Lanka also confirms that TPN No.8094 and this response therato will constitute an amendment to the MOU to that affect.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka avails itself of this opportunity to renew to the Canadian High Commission the assurances of its highest consideration.
