Subject: Your request for information on the restrictions on
textiles trade implemented by Macau (your ref.
TS/140-1.1)

Macau does not carry out any restriction on textiles trade,
as market access is completely free.

Under MFA's article 4, Macau signed seven bilateral textile
agreements containing quantitative limits to its textile exports.

The following bilateral textile agreements to which Macau is
part are presently in force:

1. Macau/Austria - January 1, 1987 to December 31, 1990
2. Macau/Canada - January 1, 1987 to December 31, 1991
3. Macau/EEC - January 1, 1987 to December 31, 1990
4. Macau/USA - January 1, 1987 to December 31, 1991
5. Macau/Finland - January 1, 1987 to December 31, 1991
6. Macau/Norway - January 1, 1988 to December 31, 1991
7. Macau/Sweden - January 1, 1988 to March 31, 1993
