Amendment of the bilateral agreement between the United States and Hungary

Note by the Chairman

Attached is a notification received from the United States of a further amendment of its bilateral agreement with Hungary. Restraints were agreed on Categories 313 (sheeting) and 604 (mmf yarn) for the period 1 March 1988 to 31 December 1991.

#### Dear Ambassador Raffaelli:

Pursuant to the provisions of paragraph 4 of Article 4 of the Arrangement Regarding International Trade in Textiles, I am instructed by my government to inform the Textiles Surveillance Body of the amendment of the bilateral textile agreement between the Government of the United Staes of America and the Government of Hungary.

This amendment provides new specific limits on cotton sheeting (category 313) and mmf yarn (category 604). The U.S. requested consultations on these two products to avoid real risk of market disruption in the context of consultations on other products in January 1988, and reached agreement with Hungary during consultations in April:

Swing and carryover/carry forward were set in accordance with paragraphs 4 and 5 of the basic bilateral, i.e., at 5 percent and 11/6 percent, respectively.

# UNITED STATES AND HUNGARY AMEND BILATERAL TEXTILE AGREEMENT

The United States and the People's Republic of Hungary exchanged notes in Budapest on June 23, 1988 and August 1, 1988, to amend their Bilateral Textile Agreement. Text of the notes follow:

## UNITED STATES NOTE

Budapest, June 23, 1988

The Embassy of the United States of America presents its compliments to the Ministry of Foreign Trade of the People's Republic of Hungary and has the honor to refer to the Arrangement regarding international trade in textiles (the Arrangement) and to the bilateral agreement between the Government of the United States of America, and the Government of the Hungarian People's Republic relating to trade in cotton, wool and man-made fiber textile products with annexes, effected by exchange of notes done at Budapest February 15 and 25, 1983, as amended (the Agreement). The Embassy also refers to discussions in Washington between representatives of the Governments of the United States and Hungary during May 23 and 24, 1988.


