Dear Ambassador Raffaelli:

I refer to my letter of June 8, 1988 on the request by the United States for Article 3.3 consultations with Thailand on mmf luggage (Category 670L) and luggage of silk blends and non-cotton vegetable fibers (Category 870).

This will confirm my oral notification that the United States pursuant to Article 3.5 of the Arrangement, has imposed restraints, effective December 13, 1988, on imports from Thailand of these products. The restraint levels are set at 6,082,616 pounds for Category 670L and at 5,917,287 pounds for category 870. The restraint period for each is from May 25, 1988 through May 24, 1989.

(COMPLIMENTARY OPINING)

THE EMBASSY OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA HAS THE HONOR TO RIFER TO THE ARRANGEMENT REGARDING INTERNATIONAL TRADE IN TEXTILES, WITH ANNEXES, DONE AT GENEVA ON DECEMBER 20, 1973 AND EXTENDED BY PROTOCOLS ADOPTED RESPECTIVELY ON LICEMBER 14, 1977, DECEMBER 22, 1981 AND JULY 31, 1986 AT GENEVA (THE ARRANGEMENT). THE EMBASSY HAS THE FURTHER BONOR TO RIFER TO SECTION 204 OF THE U.S. AGRICULTURAL ACT OF 1956, AS AMENDEL.

TURING RECINI MONIES THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES HAS NOTED THE SHARPLY RISING LEVEL OF EXPORTS OF MAN-MADE IBER LUGGAGE (CATEGORY 670-L) TO THE UNITED STATES FROM HAILAND. AFTER CAREFUL REVIEW, THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT HAS CONCLUDED THAT IMPORTS IN THIS CATEGORY ARE DISRUPTING THE UNITED STATES MARKET AND ARE THREATENING TO IMPEDE THE ORDERLY DEVELOPMENT OF TRADE AS CONTEMPLATED BY ARTICLE 3 OF THE ARRANGEMENT. A DETAILED FACTUAL STATEMENT OF THE REASONS AND JUSTIFICATION FOR IHIS CONCLUSION, WITH CURRENT DATA, IS ENCLOSED AS ANNEX A OF THIS NOTE. ACCORDINGLY, THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES HERIBY REQUESTS CONSULTATIONS WITH THE GOVERNMENT OF THAILAND TO DISCUSS AN APPROPRIATE LEVEL OF RESTRAINT FOR THAILAND S EXPORTS TO THE UNITED STATES OF MANMADE FIBER LUGGAGE (CATEGORY 670-L).

IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE 3 OF THE ARRANGEMENT, IF OUR 150 REPRESENTATIVES ARE UNABLE TO AGREE ON A MUTUALLY SATISFACTORY SOLUTION TO THIS MATTER WITHIN SIXTY DAYS, THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES RESERVES THE RIGHT TO RESTRAIN SUCH IMPORTS PRODUCED IN THAILAND AND EXPORTED DURING THE TWELVE MONTH PERIOD BEGINNING ON THE DATE OF CEIPT OF THIS REQUEST. THIS LIMIT WILL NOT BE LESS THAN THE LEVEL OF UNITED STATES' IMPORTS AS REPORTED IN U.S. GENERAL IMPORT STATISTICS, ENTERED IN THIS CATEGORY FROM THAILAND DURING THE FIRST TWELVE OF THE MOST RECENT FOURTEEN MONTHS PRICEEDING THE MONTH IN WHICH CONSULTATIONS WERE REQUESTED. BASED ON YEAR-ENDING FIBRUARY 1988 IMPORT DATA, THIS NUMBER IS 6.082.615 FOUNLS.

THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES WOULD APPRECIATE THE VIEWS OF THE GOVERNMENT OF THE KINGDOM OF THAILAND WITH RESPICT TO THAILAND'S EXPORTS OF CATEGORY 670-L TO THE UNITED STATES AND REGARDING A DATE AND PLACE FOR CONSULTATIONS.

SUMMARY AND CONCLUSIONS

U.S. IMPERTS OF MAN-MADE FIBER LUGGAGE -- CATEGORY 670 PART - FROM THAILAND WERE 6.1 MILLION POUNDS DURING THE IEAR ENDING FEBRUARY 1988, NEARLY FOUR TIMES THE 1.5 MILLION POUNDS IMPORTED A YEAR EARLIER. IN THE YEAR DING FEBRUARY 1988, THAILAND WAS THE FOURTH LARGEST SUPPLIER OF MAN-MADE FIBER LUGGAGE, ACCOUNTING FOR FOUR PERCENT OF THE TOTAL IMPORTS. IN THE PREVIOUS YEAR, THAILAND WAS THE EIGHTH LARGEST SUPPLIER, SUPPLYING ONE PERCENT OF TOTAL IMPORTS.

THE SHARP AND SUBSTANTIAL INCREASE OF LOW-VALUED MAN-MADE FIBER LUGGAGE IMPORTS FROM THAILAND IS DISRUPTING THE U.S. MARKET.

U.S. PRODUCTION AND MARKET SHARE

U.S. PRODUCTION OF MAN-MADE FIBER FABRIC FOR LUGGAGE REMAINED FLAT AT 21 MILLION POUNDS FROM 1985 THROUGH 1987. LURING THIS TWO YEAR PERIOD THE U.S. PRODUCERS' SHAEL OF THE MAN-MADE FIBER LUGGAGE MARKET DROPPED FOUR PLRCINTAGE POINTS FROM 27 PERCENT IN 1985 TO 23 PERCENT IN 1987.

J. IMPORT AND IMPORT PENETRATION

U.S. IMPORTS CF MAN-MADE FIBER LUGGAGE -- CATEGORY 670
PART -- AT 141 MILLION POUNDS IN 1987 WERE 22 PERCENT
ABOVE THE 116 MILLION POUND 1995 LEVEL. THE IMPORT TO
LOMESTIC PRODUCTION RATIO REACHED 336 PERCENT IN 1987, UP
FROM 273 PERCENT IN 1985.

DUTY-PAID IMPORT VALUES AND U.S. PRODUCERS' PRICE

APPROXIMATELY 97 PERCENT OF CATEGORY 670 PART IMPORTS FROM THAILAND DURING JANUARY-FEBRUARY 1988 ENTERED UNDER TSUSA NO. 706.4135 - MAN-MADE FIBER LUGGAGE, NOT BRAIDED. THISE IMPORTS FROM THAILAND ENTERED AT LOW CUTY-PAID VALUES, RESULTING IN WHOLESALE PRICES WELL BELOW THOSE OF COMARABLE U.S. PRODUCED LUGGAGE.

DURING RECENT MONTHS THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES HAS NOTED THE SHARPLY RISING LEVEL OF FXPORTS OF LUGGAGE OF SILK-BLENDS AND NON-COTTON VEGETABLE FIBER (CATEGORY 870) TO THE UNITED STATES FROM THAILAND. AFTER CAREFUL REVIEW. THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT HAS CONCLUDED THAT

PORTS IN THIS CATEGORY ARE DISRUPTING THE UNITED TATES' MARKET AND ARE THREATENING TO IMPEDE THE ORDERLY DEVELOPMENT OF TRADE AS CONTEMPLATED BY ARTICLE 3 OF THE ARRANGEMENT. SUMMARY AND CONCLUSIONS

U.S. IMPORTS OF CATEGORY 870 LUGGAGE -- SILK-BLEND AND VEGETABLE FIBER OTHER THAN COTTON -- FROM THAILAND REACHED 5.9 MILLION POUNDS FOR THE YEAR ENDING FEBRUARY 1988. MAKING THAILAND THE NUMBER ONE SUPPLIER ACCOUNTING

FOR 22 PERCENT OF TOTAL CATEGORY 870 IMPORTS. IMPORTS OF CATEGORY 870 FROM THAILAND WERE 4.4 MILLION POUNDS DURING THE SEVEN MCNTH PERIOD, AUGUST 1987 THROUGH FEBRUARY 1988, NEARLY SIXTEEN TIMES THE 284 THOUSAND POUNDS THE THE THE THROUGH THE THROUGH THE TATEST SEVEN MONTHS, AUGUST 1987 THROUGH FEBRUARY 1988, THAILAND'S SHARE OF CATEGORY 870 IMPORTS REACHED 28 PERCENT.

IMPORTS OF SILK-BLEND AND VEGETABLE FIBER, OTHER THAN COTTON, LUGGAGE COMPETE WITH DOMESTICALLY PRODUCED MAN-MADE FIBER LUGGAGE. THE U.S. MARKET FOR MAN-MADE FIBER LUGGAGE, CATEGORY 670 PART, HAS BEEN DISRUPTED BY IMPORTS. THE SHARP AND SUBSTANTIAL INCREASE OF CATEGORY 870 IMPORTS FROM THAILAND IS EXACERBATING THE DISRUPTION.

IMPORT PENETRATION AND MARKET SHARE

THE RATIO OF IMPORTS TO PRODUCTION FOR LUGGAGE IN CATEGORY 670 PART, LUGGAGE, INCREASED TO 336 PERCENT IN 1987. THE SHARE OF THIS MARKET HELD BY DOMESTIC MANUFACTURES DROPPED TO 23 PERCENT IN 1987. WHEN IMPORTS OF THE DIRECTLY COMPETITIVE CATEGORY 870 ARE INCLUDED, THE IMPORT TO PRODUCTION RATIO INCREASES TO 397 PERCENT ND THE DOMESTIC MANUFACTURERS' SHARE OF THE MARKET DECLINES TO 20 PERCENT.

APPROXIMATELY 99 PERCENT OF CATEGORY 870 IMPORTS FROM THAILAND DURING THE YEAR ENDING FEBRUARY 1988 ENTERED UNDER TSUSA NO. 706.3850 LUGGAGE OF VEGETABLE FIBER EXCLUDING COTTON. THESE IMPORTS FROM THAILAND ENTERED AT LOW DUTY-PAID VALUES, RESULTING IN WHOLESALE PRICES WELL BELOW THOSE OF COMPARABLE U.S. PRODUCED LUGGAGE.
