Modification of the Bilateral Agreement between the EEC and India

Note by the Chairman

Attached is a notification received from the EEC of a further modification of its bilateral agreement with India. A limit at the Community level was agreed on Category 5 (jersey's, pullovers) for the period 23 November 1988 to 31 December 1991.

Dear Ambassador

In connection with the European Economic Community's Agreement on trade in textile products with India negotiated under Article 4 of the Arrangement and initialled on 31 October 1986, I have to inform you of the following.

During the course of 1988 imports of jerseys, pullovers and the like (category 5) from India to the Community exceeded 1,980,000 pieces, being the level at which the Community could ask for consultations with a view to establishing a Community limit under the provisions of Article 8 of the The Community being of the view that there was a real risk of market disruption in this case, the two sides consulted on 24/27 January 1989, in pursuance of Articles 8 and 16 of the Agreement. As a result of these consultations, and in conformity with the provisions of the Agreement, India agreed to limit its exports to the Community as follows:

For the period 23 November-31 December 1988 an amount of 2,800,000 p. has been agreed.

These new limits contained in the Agreed Minute annexed to this letter are herewith communicated under Article 4, paragraph 4 of the Arrangement, as a modification to the Community's Agreement with India.

AGREED MINUTE

- 1. Delegations of the European Community and the Republic of India met in Brussels on 24-27 January 1989 for consultations in accordance with Article 8 of the Agreement on trade in textiles between India and the European Community, initialled on 31 October 1986.
- 2. As a result of these consultations it was agreed that India will limit its exports of Category 5 products to the Community to the following levels:
