Import of synthetic tops/spun yarn/waste (except Nylon waste) is restricted. Import of Nylon waste is allowed under OGL for Actual Users (Industrial) engaged in recovery of captolactum as certified by DGTD, New Delhi.

Cellulosic tops/spun yarn/waste has been put in the restricted list. Viscose filament yarn 600 denier and above including viscose tyre yarn has been put in the List of Limited Permissible items. Viscose filament yarn (below 600 denier) is allowed under OGL by Actual Users, Export Houses and others for stock and sale.
