This is to confirm my earlier oral notification that, effective January 11, 1990, the United States invoked the provisions of article 3.5 of the MFA to impose restraints on imports of two apparel products from Bangladesh: cotton and mmf nightwear (category 351/651) and trousers of silk and/or vegetable blends other than cotton (category 847). The restraint period for each category is from July 30, 1989 to July 29, 1990. The restraints are set at 206,298 dozen for category 351/651 and at 228,956 dozen for category 847.

THE EMBASSY OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA PRESENTS ITS COMPLIMENTS TO THE GOVERNMENT OF THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF BANGLADESH AND HAS THE HONOR TO REFER TO THE ARRANGEMENT REGARDING INTERNATIONAL TRADE IN TEXTILES DONE AT GENEVA ON DECEMBER 20, 1973 AND EXTENDED BY PROTOCOLS ADOPTED RESPECTIVELY ON DECEMBER 14, 1987. DECEMBER 22, 1981 AND JULY 31, 1986, DONE AT GENEVA (HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS THE ARRANGEMENT). UNDER ARTICLE THREE OF THE ARRANGEMENT, IF, IN THE OPINION OF ANY PARTICIPATING IMPORTING COUNTRY, ITS MARKET IS BEING DISRUPTED IN TERMS OF THE DEFINITION OF MARKET DISRUPTION IN ANNEX A OF THE ARRANGEMENT BY IMPORTS OF A CERTAIN TEXTILE PRODUCT NOT ALREADY SUBJECT TO RESTRAINT, IT SHALL SEEK CONSULTATIONS WITH THE PARTICIPATING EXPORTING COUNTRY OR COUNTRIES CONCERNED WITH A VIEW TO REMOVING SUCH DISRUPTION.

DURING RECENT MONTHS THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES HAS NOTICED THE SHARP AND SUBSTANTIAL INCREASE IN IMPORTS OF CATEGORY 847 VEGETABLE FIBER, OTHER THAN COTTON, AND SILK-BLEND TROUSERS. SLACKS AND SHORTS FROM BANGLADESH TO THE UNITED STATES. DURING 1987, THE UNITED STATES IMPORTED 17.369 DOZENS OF THESE PRODUCTS FROM BANGLADESH. AND 91.413 DOZENS IN 1988.

VEGETABLE FIRER. OTHER THAN COTTON, AND SILK-BLEND TROUSERS, SLACKS AND SHORTS ARE AN IMPORTANT AND SENSITIVE PRODUCT LINE IN THE UNITED STATES, AND THEY ARE DIRECTLY COMPETITIVE WITH COTTON TROUSERS, SLACKS AND SHORTS. A DESCRIPTION OF THE EFFECT OF SUCH IMPORTS ON THE UNITED STATES MARKET, RECENT TRENDS OF SUCH IMPORTS FROM BANGLADESH, AND A TABLE OF IMPORTS AND DOMESTIC PRICE DATA ARE APPENDED AS ANNEX A, WHICH IS TO BE REGARDED AS AN INTEGRAL PART OF THIS NOTE.

IMPORTS FROM BANGLADESH HAVE INCREASED FROM 17.369 TOZENS IN 1987 TO 91.413 DOZENS IN 1988, MORE THAN A FIVEFOLD INCREASE. THE CURRENT LEVEL OF IMPORTS OF THESE VEGETABLE FIBER, OTHER THAN COTTON, AND SILK-BLEND TROUSERS, SLACKS AND SHORTS FROM BANGLADESH IS DISRUPTING THE U.S. MARKET.

IMPORTS FROM BANGLADESH, WHOSE PRICES ARE WELL BELOW THOSE PREVAILING IN THE U.S. MARKET, IF PERMITTED TO INCREASE AT OR NEAR THE CURRENT RATE, WOULD INFLICT FURTHER SERIOUS DAMAGE TO U.S. MANUFACTURERS.

IN ORDER TO ALLEVIATE MARKET DISRUPTION AND TO ENSURE EQUITABLE TREATMENT OF THOSE COUNTRIES PARTY TO THE ARRANGEMENT WHICH PRESENTLY LIMIT THEIR EXPORTS OF THIS CATEGORY TO THE UNITED STATES, THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES HEREBY REQUESTS CONSULTATIONS WITH THE GOVERNMENT OF BANGLADESH TO DISCUSS APPROPRIATE LEVELS OF RESTRAINT FOR ITS EXPORTS OF CATEGORY 847 PRODUCTS ENTERING THE UNITED STATES.

IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE THREE OF THE ARRANGEMENT, TO WHICH BOTH THE GOVERNMENT OF BANGLADESH AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES ARE PARTIES, IF THE TWO GOVERNMENTS ARE UNABLE TO AGREE ON A MUTUALLY SATISFACTORY SOLUTION TO THIS MATTER WITHIN SIXTY DAYS. THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES RESERVES THE RIGHT TO RESTRAIN IMPORTS OF CATEGORY 847 VEGETABLE FIBER, OTHER THAN COTTON. AND SILK-BLEND TROUSERS. SLACKS AND SHORTS PRODUCED IN BANGLADESH AND EXPORTED DURING THE TWELVE MONTH PERIOD BEGINNING ON THE DATE OF YOUR RECEIPT OF HIS REQUEST. TO A LEVEL NOT LESS THAN THE LEVEL OF JINITED STATES IMPORTS OF THIS PRODUCT FROM BANGLADESH URING THE FIRST TWELVE OF THE MOST RECENT FOURTEEN MONTH PERIOD, NOT INCLUDING THE MONTH OF JULY. THE AMOUNT FOR THIS TWELVE MONTH PERIOD MAY 1, 1988 THROUGH APRIL 30, 1989 WOULD BE 228,956 DOZENS.

THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES WOULD APPRECIATE THE VIEWS OF THE GOVERNMENT OF THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF BANGLADESH WITH RESPECT TO BANGLADESH'S EXPORTS IN CATEGORY 847 VEGETABLE FIBER, OTHER THAN COTTON, AND SILK-BLEND TROUSERS, SLACKS AND SHORTS TO THE UNITED STATES AND WITH RESPECT TO A DATE AND PLACE FOR CONSULTATIONS.

MARKET STATEMENT VEGETABLE FIBER, OTHER THAN COTTON, AND SILK-BLEND TROUSERS, SLACKS AND SHORTS (CATEGORY 847) BANGLADESH JULY 1989

IMPORT SITUATION AND CONCLUSIONS

U.S. IMPORTS OF VEGETABLE FIBER (OTHER THAN COTTON) AND SILK-BLEND TROUSERS, SLACKS AND SHORTS (CATEGORY 847) FROM BANGLADESH REACHED 228,956 DOZEN DURING THE YEAR ENDING APRIL 1989, ALMOST 6 TIMES THE 39,281 DOZEN IMPORTED A YEAR EARLIER. DURING THE FIRST FOUR MONTHS OF 1989 IMPORTS OF CATEGORY 847 FROM BANGLADESH REACHED 159,455 DOZEN, OVER 7 TIMES THE 21,912 DOZEN IMPORTED DURING THE SAME PERIOD IN 1988 AND ALMOST DOUBLE 2. BANGLADESH'S IMPORTS FOR ALL OF CALENDAR YEAR 1988.

VIRTUALLY ALL OF THE IMPORTS OF TROUSERS, SLACKS AND SHORTS IN CATEGORY 847 ARE OF VEGETABLE FIBER, OTHER THAN COTTON. AND COMPETE DIRECTLY WITH DOMESTICALLY PRODUCED COTTON TROUSERS. SLACKS AND SHORTS (CATEGORY 347/348). THE U.S. MARKET FOR COTTON TROUSERS, SHORTS AND SLACKS (CATEGORY 347/348) IS BEING DISRUPTED BY IMPORTS.

CATEGORY 347/348 IMPORTS FROM BANGLADESH HAVE BEEN UNDER RESTRAINT SINCE FEBRUARY 1, 1986. THE SHARP AND SUBSTANTIAL INCREASE OF CATEGORY 847 IMPORTS FROM BANGLADESH IS CAUSING FURTHER DISRUPTION IN THE U.S. COTTON TROUSERS, SLACKS AND SHORTS MARKET.

IMPORT PENETRATION AND MARKET SHARE

U.S. PRODUCTION OF COTTON TROUSERS, SLACKS, AND SHORTS (CATEGORY 347/348) FELL 15 PERCENT IN 1988 TO ITS LOWEST LEVEL IN 13 YEARS. THE RATIO OF IMPORTS TO PRODUCTION IN CATEGORY 347/348 INCREASED TO 84 PERCENT IN 1988. THE SHARE OF THE COTTON TROUSERS, SLACKS, AND SHORTS MARKET HELD BY DOMESTIC MANUFACTURERS DROPPED TO 54 PERCENT IN 1988.

U.S. WORLDWIDE IMPORTS OF VEGETABLE FIBER, OTHER THAN COTTON, AND SILK-BLEND TROUSERS, SLACES AND SHORTS (CATEGORY 847) — ADJUSTED FOR 1987 OVERSHIPMENTS — INCREASED 38 PERCENT FROM 1,653,741 DOZEN IN 1987 TO 2,287,800 DOZEN IN 1988.

WHEN IMPORTS OF THE DIRECTLY COMPETITIVE CATEGORY 847 ARE INCLUDED IN THE 347/348 MARKET ANALYSIS, THE IMPORT TO PRODUCTION RATIO JUMPS TO 94 PERCENT AND THE DOMESTIC MANUFACTURERS' SHARE OF THE MARKET FALLS TO 52 PERCENT.

DUTY-PAID VALUE AND U.S. PRODUCERS PRICE

APPROXIMATELY 95 PERCENT OF CATEGORY 847 IMPORTS FROM BANGLADESH IN THE FIRST FOUR MONTHS OF 1989 ENTERED UNDER HTS NUMBER: 6204.69.9040 - WOMEN'S AND GIRLS' TROUSERS. BREECHES AND SHORTS SUBJECT TO OTHER THAN COTTON, WOOL OR MAN-MADE FIBER RESTRAINTS. THESE TROUSERS ENTERED THE U.S. AT DUTY-PAID LANDED VALUES BELOW U.S. PRODUCERS' PRICES FOR DIRECTLY COMPETING COTTON GARMENTS.

DURING 1987, THE UNITED STATES IMPORTED 44,559 DOZENS OF THESE PAJAMAS AND OTHER NIGHTWEAR FROM BANGLADESH, AND 163,229 DOZENS IN 1988.

COTTON AND MAN-MADE FIBER PAJAMAS AND OTHER NIGHTWEAR ARE AN IMPORTANT AND SENSITIVE PRODUCT LINE IN THE UNITED PURSUANT TO THE ARRANGEMENT AND CONSISTENT WITH STATES. GOALS SET OUT IN ARTICLE ONE OF THE ARRANGEMENT TO ACHIEVE THE EXPANSION OF TRADE WHILE AT THE SAME TIME ENSURING "AVOIDANCE OF DISRUPTIVE EFFECTS , THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA HAS NEGOTIATED LEVELS OF TRADE FOR THESE PRODUCTS WITH MANY EXPORTING COUNTRIES, SOME OF WHICH ARE BELOW THE CURRENT LEVELS OF IMPORTS FROM BANGLADESH. IMPORTS FROM BANGLADESH HAVE INCREASED FROM 44,559 DOZENS IN 1987 TO 163,229 DOZENS IN 1988. AN ALMOST FOURFOLD INCREASE. THE CURRENT LEVEL OF IMPORTS OF THESE PAJAMAS AND OTHER NIGHTWEAR FROM BANGLADESH IS DISRUPTING THE U.S. MARKET. IMPORTS FROM BANGLADESH, WHOSE PRICES ARE WELL BELOW THOSE PREVAILING IN THE U.S. MARKET, IF PERMITTED TO INCREASE AT OR NEAR THE CURRENT RATE, WOULD INFLICT FURTHER SERIOUS DAMAGE TO U.S. MANUFACTURERS.

TO A LEVEL NOT LESS THAN THE LEVEL OF UNITED STATES IMPORTS OF THIS PRODUCT FROM BANGLADESH DURING THE FIRST TWELVE OF THE MOST RECENT FOURTEEN MONTH PERIOD. NOT INCLUDING THE MONTH OF JULY. THE AMOUNT FOR THIS TWELVE MONTH PERIOD MAY 1,1988 THROUGH APRIL 30, 1989 WOULD BE 206,298 DOZENS.

THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES WOULD APPRECIATE THE VIEWS OF THE GOVERNMENT OF THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF BANGLADESH WITH RESPECT TO BANGLADESH'S EXPORTS IN CATEGORY 351/651 PAJAMAS AND OTHER NIGHTWEAR TO THE UNITED STATES AND WITH RESPECT TO A DATE AND PLACE FOR CONSULTATIONS.

SUMMARY AND CONCLUSIONS

U.S. IMPORTS OF PAJAMAS AND OTHER NIGHTWEAR (CATEGORY 351/651) FROM BANGLADESH REACHED 206,298 DOZEN DURING THE YEAR ENDING APRIL 1989. NEARLY 4 TIMES THE 56,988 DOZEN IMPORTED A YEAR EARLIER. DURING THE FIRST FOUR MONTHS OF 1989, IMPORTS OF PAJAMAS AND OTHER NIGHTWEAR (CATEGORY 351/651) FROM BANGLADESH REACHED 59,608 DOZEN, ALMOST 4 TIMES THE AMOUNT IMPORTED IN THE FIRST FOUR MONTHS OF 1988. IMPORTS FROM BANGLADESH WERE 44,559 DOZEN IN 1987 AND 163,229 DOZEN IN 1988.

THE SHARP AND SUBSTANTIAL INCREASE IN CATEGORY 351/651 IMPORTS FROM BANGLADESH IS DISRUPTING THE U.S. MARKET FOR PAJAMAS AND OTHER NIGHTWEAR.

U.S. PRODUCTION AND MARKET SHARE

U.S. PRODUCTION OF PAJAMAS AND OTHER NIGHTWEAR, INCLUDING INFANTS, HAS BEEN ON THE DECLINE SINCE 1983, FALLING FROM 22,836,000 DOZEN IN 1983 TO 19,933,000 DOZEN IN 1985, A 13 PERCENT DECLINE. U.S. PRODUCTION OF PAJAMAS AND OTHER NIGHTWEAR (EXCLUDING INFANTS—SEE TABLE I, FOOTNOTE 1/) DECLINED FROM 17,078,000 DOZEN IN 1986 TO 14,293,000 DOZEN IN 1988, A DECLINE OF 18 PERCENT. THE DOMESTIC MANUFACTURERS' SHARE OF THE PAJAMAS AND OTHER NIGHTWEAR MARKET DROPPED FROM 77 PERCENT IN 1986 TO 71 PERCENT IN 1988.

U.S. IMPORTS AND IMPORT PENETRATION

U.S. IMPORTS OF PAJAMAS AND OTHER NIGHTWEAR (CATEGORY 351/651) MORE THAN DOUBLED, INCREASING FROM 2,611.000 DOZEN IN 1982 TO 5,770,000 DOZEN IN 1988. IMPORTS CONTINUE TO INCREASE IN 1989, UP 12 PERCENT IN THE FIRST FOUR MONTHS OF 1989 OVER THE SAME PERIOD IN 1988. THE RATIO OF IMPORTS TO DOMESTIC PRODUCTION INCREASED 10 PERCENTAGE POINTS IN JUST TWO YEARS, INCREASING FROM 31 PERCENT IN 1986 TO TO 41 PERCENT IN 1988.

DUTY-PAID VALUE AND U.S. PRODUCERS' PRICE

APPROXIMATELY 68 PERCENT OF CATEGORY 351/651 IMPORTS FROM BANGLADESH DURING THE FIRST FOUR MONTHS OF 1989 ENTERED UNDER HTSUSA NUMBER 6207.21.0030 — MEN'S COTTON NIGHTSHIRTS AND PAJAMAS, OTHER THAN OF YARN DYED FABRIC; 6207.22.0000 — MEN'S OR BOYS' MAN-MADE FIBER NIGHTSHIRTS AMD PAJAMAS, OTHER THAN OF YARN DYED FABRIC; 6208.21.0020 WOMEN'S COTTON NIGHTSHIRTS AND PAJAMAS, OTHER THAN OF YARN DYED FABRIC. THESE NIGHTSHIRTS AND PAJAMAS ENTERED THE U.S. AT LANDED DUTY-PAID VALUES BELOW U.S. PRODUCERS' PRICES FOR COMPARABLE NIGHTSHIRTS AND PAJAMAS.
