Dear Ambassador Raffaelli:

This will confirm my earlier oral and written reports that, with respect to the findings and recommendations of the TSB at its March meeting, the U.S. allowed the restraint on one category (341/641) to lapse on March 30, and rescinded the restraint on category 847. The U.S. also dropped the call on category 345, for which the TSB had found market disruption, because of subsequent changes in the market situation for that category.

As explained in my letter of May 2 the U.S. was not able to accept the TSB's recommendation to terminate the restraint on category 336/636.

With respect to the recommendations that the two parties consult further on categories 300 part, 314, and 614, consultations were held on these and other items in Geneva on May 24 and 25. The parties did not reach agreement on any of the three.
