This responds to your letter requesting information, pursuant to Article 11 of the MFA, on restrictions maintained on trade in textiles by the Government of the United States.

As of this date, the United States has negotiated restrictions on textile products with 35 governments and is maintaining unilateral restraints on products from Myanmar.

Since our last report in 1990, the United States has discontinued seven bilateral agreements: Argentina, East Germany, Japan, Myanmar, Peru, Trinidad and Tobago, and Uruguay, and is not currently implementing agreements concluded with governments of the former USSR and Yugoslavia. Six agreements have been added: Columbia, Figi, Nigeria, Panama, Romania and Thailand.

Enclosed is a table outlining the status of the various agreements as of this date. In some cases, agreements have been negotiated, but formal notes have not been exchanged.

More detailed information will, as necessary to update the TSB's report, be provided separately.
