Note by the Chairman

Attached is a notification received from Canada of a two-month interim restraint under Article 3:6 on imports of underwear from Jamaica effective 16 March 1994.¹

This is further to my letter of March 12 in which I informed you that the Canadian authorities were requesting that Jamaica agree to a 12-month extension of the restraint of underwear.

Unfortunately, no agreement was reached on extending this restraint. Under these circumstances, and in light of the disruption that continues to prevail in the Canadian market, of the strong potential for exports from Jamaica to exacerbate this situation and of Jamaica's ability to ship high volumes for quick delivery, the Canadian authorities have been left with no alternative but to impose a restraint on imports of underwear from Jamaica.

Attached please find copy of a Diplomatic Note that was delivered to the Jamaican authorities on March 15, 1993, in which the Canadian authorities advised that they were imposing a 2-month restraint on imports of underwear from Jamaica, pursuant to the provisions of Article 3:6 of the Arrangement Regarding International Trade in Textiles.

The Canadian High Commission presents its compliments to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Foreign Trade of Jamaica and wishes to refer to the arrangement regarding International Trade in Textiles (MFA). Pursuant to Article 3 of the MFA the Canadian authorities hereby request consultations with Jamaican authorities in respect of exports of underwear to Canada.

The Canadian High Commission wishes to advise the Jamaican authorities that disruption continues to prevail in the Canadian market and that there is strong potential for exports from Jamaica to exacerbate that disruption, threatening to impede the orderly development of trade between Canada and Jamaica.

Imports of underwear from Jamaica rose from 344,034 units in 1991 to 1,129,876 units in 1992. Imports continued to surge, more than doubling in 1993 to reach 2,379,715 units reflecting not only Jamaica's capability to export but also the generosity of the interim restraint imposed by Canada. It is difficult to extrapolate what would have been the level if no restraint had been introduced. Jamaica's exports to Canada of underwear exceed 19 of the 26 restraint levels that Canada has in place with other exporting countries.

puring the same period Canadian manufacturers of underwear have experienced a decline in Canadian shipments from 62 million in 1992 to 59 million in 1993, while the domestic shipments (i.e. taking away the exports) decreased from 60.7 million in 1992 to 57.5 million in 1993, a decline of 5.2%. As a result, the share of the Apparent Canadian Market for underwear supplied by Canadian manufacturers has declined from an high of 68% in 1990 to 56% in 1992 and to only 46.8% in 1993. Meanwhile the market share held by imports has increased from 32% in 1990 to 44% in 1992 and in a very strong 53.2% in 1993. Jamaica has itself increased its share of total imports from 2.4% in 1992 to 3.6% in 1993.

Employment in the Canadian underwear industry has continued to decline in 1993. At the end of 1992, the level of employment in the sector stood at 3,053. By December, 1993 employment had declined by 5.8% to 2,875.

The low prices at which underwear from Jamaica is offered in the Canadian market also contribute to the market disruption being caused. The average FOB price of underwear sourced in Jamaica in 1993 was .80 dollar Canadian, compared with an average price of underwear imported from all countries of 1.45 dollars Canadian. An average warehouse price for domestically produced underwear is 2.80 dollars Canadian per unit.

The attached annexes provide further details regarding imports of underwear from Jamaica, in particular for the 12 month period ending in December 1993, which is the reference period referred to in Annex B of the MFA. Also included is data on total imports of underwear from all sources and the prices of such imports, and the apparent Canadian market for underwear for the period 1990 to 1993.

In light of the very real potential for disruptive impact on the market given Jamaica's capacity to ship high volumes, as seen in monthly levels of up to 710,100 units in the early months of 1993, as well as its ability for quick delivery, we will be imposing as per article 3.6 of the MFA an interim restraint on the importation of underwear that originates in Jamaica. This interim restraint will be in place for two months effective March 16, 1994. As provided for in Annex B of the MFA, the restraint level will be 253,359 units per month. Should Canada and Jamaica be unable to conclude an agreement within that two month time frame, Canada reserves its right under Article 3.5 of the MFA.

The Canadian High Commission avails itself of this opportunity to renew to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Foreign Trade of Jamaica the assurances of its highest consideration.
